

MARCH 6, 1951

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Recessed Session March 6, 1951 at 8:00 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor and Councilmen Freeman, Johnson, Corbett and Rogers.

The first matter to come before the Council was a plat of a new proposed addition to Bel-Aire. This plat was presented by Dave Benton and is to be known as South Bel-Aire. The Mayor read a letter from the Planning Board which brought several items which the Board did not approve. One item being no sidewalks, and another, three streets which were only 40 feet wide. This matter was discussed by the Mayor and Council, the members of the Planning Board, Mr. Benton and Dale Parrish at considerable length after which it was taken under advisement and the Mayor asked that the Planning Board meet at a later date with the Council to go over the matter.

Mr. Benton then presented a plat of a section the Hughes Imperial Heights which he asked to have approved by the Council. There was one objection to this Addition. It being that there is a Street, Morningside Drive, which forms a circle when considered with another section of the Addition that creates numbering problems. It was agreed that this could be corrected after which it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Freeman that the plat be approved. Roll call voting Aye, Corbett, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. Voting Nay, None.

Another plat known as the Anderson Jeppson Addition was presented which had been formerly approved by the Planning Board and after going over this Addition it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Freeman that this Addition be approved. Roll call voting Aye, Rogers, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. Voting Nay, None.

Mr. Benton presented the plat of the Riviera Addition which is a re-subdivision of property already in the City. This plat was not approved by the Planning Board and the Mayor stated that a previous agreement and approval was given this property while B. W. Clark was Mayor and Mayor Sutton recommended that this former agreement be followed. The matter was tabled.

At this time, the Clerk read the minutes of the previous Meeting and it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the same be approved as read. Roll call voting Aye, Johnson, Freeman, Corbett and Rogers. Voting Nay, None.

The bills for the month of February, having been audited by the Finance Committee were presented for payment as follows:

It was moved by Rogers and seconded by Corbett that the bills be allowed as presented and the Clerk authorized to issue warrants in payment of the same. Roll call voting Aye, Corbett, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. Voting Nay, None.

R. D. Polson representing the Armstrong Heating Company, had requested that in as much as he was using a building for residential purposes which had formerly been used for commercial that

It was moved that both parties be allowed credit in that it appeared that the bills were not entirely correct. It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Rogers. Roll call voting Aye, 4. The claim of Squire Barlow and his tenant, Harry Folsom, for damage done by water to a residence on First Street was presented by the Clerk. Barlow's claim is for \$125.00 and Folsom's claim is for \$300.00. The matter was referred to the City Attorney for investigation.

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The Mayor asked the City Attorney to explain a suggested ordinance which required that proposed additions be accompanied by a bond which guaranteed completion of the project as to streets and utilities and that the bond be filed with the plat. After discussion the matter was referred to the City Engineer and City Attorney for further study.

An ordinance entitled:

“AN ORDINANCE RELOCATING AND FIXING THE WEST PROPERTY LINE OF CURTIS AVENUE ALONG THE EAST SIDE OF BLOCKS FOUR AND FIVE OF SOUTH PARK ADDITION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS”

was read at length by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Johnson that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. It was seconded by Councilman Freeman. The question being, “Shall the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be read on three several days be dispensed with?” Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 4; Nay, None. Three-fourths of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, “Shall the ordinance pass?” Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 4; Nay, None. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed.

The Mayor asked the members of the Council to approve the appointment of Wayne Clifford, as effective near 1-1951, as Desk Sergeant in the Police Department.

It was moved by Corbett and seconded by Johnson that the appointment be approved. Roll call voting Aye, 4. Voting Nay, None.

It was moved by Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye, 4.
