

FEBRUARY 16, 1951

February 16, 1951 being the regular meeting day of the City Council, the Meeting was held in the City Council Chambers at 8:00 P.M. There being present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Johnson, Freeman, Corbett; Councilman Rogers absent. Also present: John Ferebaugh, representing the City Attorney; Charles H. Williams, City Clerk; when the following were had.

The minutes of the Meetings of February 6th and 9th were read by the Clerk and it was moved that the minutes be approved with one correction. The motion was seconded by Corbett. Roll call voting Aye, 3. One Absent.

Members of the Church of Jehovah Witnesses appeared before the Council and requested that they be given permission to rent the armory building for a church convention to be held May 11th - 12th -13th, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The matter was taken under advisement to be checked into as to availability.

Fred Swanson appeared before the Council and asked that he be given credit for installing of a water line on the west side and that the credit given be applied against his delinquent water account. This matter was referred to Claude Black to check upon and see if the water line is in the City limits.

ORDINANCE NO. 762

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO SELL BEER TO ANY PERSON TO BE CONSUMED ON THE PREMISES WHERE SOLD, WHEN THE PLACE OF BUSINESS OR PREMISES IS WITHIN 300 FEET FROM ANY PUBLIC SCHOOL, MEASURED IN A STRAIGHT LINE TO THE NEAREST ENTRANCE TO THE LICENSES PREMISES, AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

The foregoing entitled Ordinance was read and after due discussion it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. The question being, "Shall the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be read on three several days be dispensed with? Roll call voting Aye, 3. Voting Nay, None. Three-fourths of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rules dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "Shall the ordinance pass?" Roll call voting Aye, 3. Voting Nay, None. One Absent. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed.

It was moved by Corbett and seconded by Johnson that the City refund, to the businesses affected by the passing of the Ordinance on sale of beer within 300 feet of schools, all fees paid for beer licenses in the excess of \$25.00, also moved that the Clerk notify by registered mail the Elm Street Grocery, Davis Grocery on Elm Street and Don Jones the operator of the Park Grocery, that this ordinance affects them and that they are prohibited from selling beer to be consumed on the premises. Roll call voting Aye, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. Absent, Rogers.

Two letters were read from the neighboring Cities of Rigby and Ashton commending our Fire Department for the splendid service rendered at the time of fires in each town. Both stated that the damage would have been far greater if our equipment and men had not responded.

There being no further business to come before the Meeting, it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Freeman, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye, 3. Rogers being absent.
