

MAY 7, 1951

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, met in Recessed Session May 7, 1951, at 8 P.M. in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho. There were present: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Foote, Rogers and Johnson; S. R. Rostad, City Clerk; T. R. Peters, Purchasing Agent; Art Smith, City Attorney.

The minutes of the Regular Meeting held on April 20, 1951 were read and approved with one correction. The minutes of the Meeting (Special) held on April 30, 1951, were read and approved as read.

On motion by Freeman and seconded by Rogers, the above petitions for BARTENDER PERMITS were approved by the Council. Roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

The application for SECONDHAND STORE by Harry Dobson and the application for AUCTIONEER by S. D. Blanton were presented by the Clerk. It was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the foregoing applications be granted and the proper licenses be issued. Roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

A claim presented by the Carl E. Nelson Co., of Logan, Utah, in the amount of \$25,000.00 was part payment on the 10% withheld from paving district estimates on L.I.D. No. 21. It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Foote, that the same be allowed for payment. Roll call voting Aye, Rogers, Freeman, Foote and Johnson. Nay, None.

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It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the bills be allowed and the Clerk authorized to draw warrants on the proper funds in payment of the same. Voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

Reverend Clark J. Wood read a prepared statement regarding BEER LICENSES 300' from public schools and suggested that no minors be allowed where beer is consumed on the premises where sold and etc.

Mr. Benton presented re-plat No. 1, Solaria Tract, promoted by Jack Pouch on west side, north of West Broadway and west of Airport Road. It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Freeman that the plat be accepted and approved as presented. On roll call, voting Aye, Foote, Rogers, Freeman, and Johnson. Nay, None.

A letter from Alfred J. Pouch, regarding a public park in the Solaria Tract was presented. It was the sense of the Council that there would be no maintenance or development of this park the coming fiscal year.

Mr. Benton presented to the Council a plat of South Bel-Aire Addition. After some discussion it was referred to the Street Committee.

The monthly reports of the various Departments were read by the Clerk. On motion made by Rogers and seconded by Freeman the various reports were accepted. Roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

A petition for sewer by several property owners in the 500 and 600 Blocks of Cleveland was read. It was ordered placed on file as this is being considered in a special improvement district.

A letter of May 5, 1951, was read from I. E. Davis regarding damage done by the moving of Willow Creek. It was referred to the City Attorney for attention.

A letter of February 28, 1951, from Squire Barlow and a letter from Harvey Folsom were read regarding damage by water to a residence on First Street. It was referred to the City Attorney for investigation.

ORDINANCE NO. 769

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE # 792 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO SELL BEER TO ANY PERSON TO BE CONSUMED ON THE PREMISES WHERE SOLD WHEN THE PLACE OF BUSINESS OR PREMISES IS WITHIN 300 FEET FROM ANY PUBLIC SCHOOL MEASURED IN A STRAIGHT LINE FROM THE NEAREST ENTRANCE TO THE PREMISES TO THE NEAREST POINT ON THE PROPERTY LINE OF THE SCHOOL, AND EXCEPTING FROM ITS PROVISIONS SALES OF BEER TO BE CONSUMED IN A ROOM WHERE MINORS ARE NOT ADMITTED.

was read at length by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Freeman that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. It was seconded by Councilman Foote. The question being, "Shall the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be read on three several days be dispensed with?" Roll call resulted as follows: Aye, 4; Nay, None. Three-fourths of the

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Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "Shall the ordinance pass?" Roll call resulted as follows: Aye, Freeman, Rogers, and Foote; Nay, None. Johnson passed. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed.

The application for BEER LICENSE by Garth Gehring, C/O I. F. Baseball Club, was presented by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Freeman that this license be granted and the proper license issued. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

The proposal by the Standard Oil Company of California, asking for an extension of their lease, covering parcel of ground used for aircraft fueling facilities for Western Air and Empire Airlines at the Municipal Airport, for a period of five (5) years, from January 1, 1951 at a rental of eight dollars and fifty cents (\$8.50) per year, was presented to the Council. On motion by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers, the proposal was accepted. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

It was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the bonds of the City Clerk and City Treasurer be reduced from \$50,000.00 to \$30,000.00. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

It was moved by Councilman Rogers and seconded by Freeman, that the rating of Dow Young be approved as that of Patrol Sergeant. On roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.

It was moved by Councilman Johnson and seconded by Rogers that the Council adjourn. Roll call voting Aye, 4. Nay, None.
