Before these licenses were voted on by the City Council Rev. Clark J. The Clerk's finance report and the meat report were read and approved.

The application for Bessie Lambert of 323 Hill Street was read by the Clerk and discussed by the Council and it was moved by Rogers and seconded by Freeman that the application be denied. Roll call voting Aye, Rogers, Freeman, and Corbett. Voting Nay, None.

A letter from the Western Airlines was read by the Mayor, requesting a renewal of the lease on the Airport with the same terms and conditions as the previous lease. This matter was taken under advisement.

DECEMBER 19, 1950

A letter from the Building Trades Council read by the Mayor offered the service and support of the Council in the City's Defense Program. Another letter from the Council of Churchwomen was read which commended the action taken by the Mayor and City Council with reference to slot machines and gambling in the City during the past year.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye, 3. One Absent.
