

OCTOBER 23, 1950

October 20, 1950 being the regular date for the City Council to meet, the Mayor ordered the Meeting recessed to October 23, 1950 at 8:00 P.M.

The City Council met in Recessed Session October 23, 1950, and there were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. Councilman Corbett being absent. There were also present: Charles H. Williams, City Clerk and E. A. Owen, City Attorney.

The minutes of the Meeting of October 6, 1950 were read and two corrections were made. The first being with reference to the City making application to the C. A. A. for funds to install Airport lights. The W. C. Kunter plat was approved subject to the final approval of the City Engineer. After these corrections it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the minutes be approved. Roll call voting Aye, 3. Voting Nay, None.

The Mayor asked Councilman Freeman to report on the soot condition at the Catholic Hospital and it was reported that the condition had improved. The matter was held over for further consideration.

In the matter of the claim of I. E. Davis and others after some discussion the Mayor asked the advice of the City Attorney and he recommended that the claim for \$2500.00 be turned down but that the City either move the creek 7 feet or offer to pay \$500.00 for the ground now occupied by the creek. It was agreed that this would be the procedure.

C. R. Black was asked to report on the storm sewer describing the condition near the Eagle Rock School where it enters the River and he stated that the smell was bad but that the best remedy he had at this time was to either pipe out further into the River or run a sewer line down the River away from the property which it now interferes with. Mr. Black was advised to check on the matter and advise the Council at a later Meeting.

Application for two BARTENDER permits were presented by the Clerk and it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the permits be approved pending the issuance of State Licenses. Roll call voting Aye, 3. Voting Nay, None.

The truck route in the south part of the City was discussed and the Chief of Police and Ray R. Moore were directed to work out appropriate signs to enable the trucks to follow the route.

Joel G. Anderson called to the attention of the Mayor and Council that the property east of Wabash Avenue and north of First Street was not being platted out so that the streets now established which run east and west, will not be permitted to be extended. The matter was discussed but a solution was arrived at.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the Meeting adjourn.
