

**SEPTEMBER 15, 1950**

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Session the 15<sup>th</sup> day of September, in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho at 8:00 P.M. There was present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. Councilman Rogers being absent. There was also present: Charles H. Williams, City Clerk.

The minutes of the Meeting held September 8, 1950, were read and it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Freeman that they be approved. Roll call voting Aye, Freeman, Corbett, and Johnson.

The applications of J. C. Zamon and H. J. Hamilton for Auctioneer Licenses were presented by the Clerk. Stanley Berland, of the Retail Merchants Division of the Chamber of Commerce, registered objection to the issuance of the licenses. The matter was discussed by the Mayor and Councilmen and it was stated that these applicants were going to operate a jewelry sale at the Serge Marshall Store. The matter was taken under advisement to investigate with permission given the Mayor to order the licenses issued if he saw fit.

The application of A. H. Palmer & Sons for a Master Plumber license was presented. The application having been approved by the Plumbing Inspector, it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the application be granted. Roll call voting Aye, Corbett, Johnson, and Freeman. Voting Nay, None. One absent.

The application of Safeway Store #334, 240 E. Street, for a license to sell Packaged Beer was presented by the Clerk and it was moved by Corbett and seconded by Freeman that the license be issued. Roll call voting Aye, Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett. Voting Nay, None. One Absent.

**ORDINANCE NO. 752**

"AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND CONTROLLING THE LOCATION, PLACEMENT, USE AND OCCUPATION OF HOUSE TRAILERS AND TRAILER COURTS WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO; DECLARING THE EXERCISE OF THE POLICE POWER OF THE COUNCIL IN SAID MATTERS; DEFINING THE TERMS HOUSE TRAILER AND TRAILER COURT; FIXING RESTRICTIONS ON HOUSE TRAILERS AND OCCUPANCY OF TRAILER COURTS; REQUIRING PERMITS AND FIXING THEREFORE AND PROVIDING FOR RENEWAL AND REVOCATION OF PERMITS; FIXING MINIMUM SPACE OCCUPIED BY HOUSE TRAILERS AND ACCOMMODATIONS OF TRAILER COURTS AND MAINTENANCE OF SAME AT MINIMUM STANDARDS; PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE BY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND FIXING THE PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF."

The foregoing Ordinance was read in the third and final reading and it was moved by Corbett and seconded by Freeman that the Ordinance be passed on the final reading and the Clerk directed to publish the same as provided by law. Roll call voting Aye, Freeman, Corbett, and Johnson. Voting Nay, None.

An ordinance entitled,

“AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR CONNECTION OF TANK HEATER SERVICE IN SINGLE FAMILY AND DUPLEX DWELLINGS IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO.”

was read at length by the Clerk and it was moved by Councilman Freeman and seconded by Councilman Corbett that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three days be dispensed with. Roll call voting Aye, Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett. Voting Nay, None. One Absent. Three-fourths of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, “Shall the ordinance pass?” Roll call voting Aye, Freeman, Corbett, and Johnson. Voting Nay, None. One Absent.

The application of Gus Lurus to move his store back off the street on Elm was read by the Mayor and it was agreed by the Mayor and members of the Council that the move would be agreeable with the City.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye, Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett.
