

MAY 19, 1950

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Session, May 19, 1950. There being present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Corbett, Rogers, and Freeman. Also present: Charles H. Williams, City Clerk and E. O. Owen, City Attorney.

The Mayor asked the Clerk what business he had to come before the Council and the report of Eathing and Graves, Meat Inspectors, was read and also a petition on planting trees on East 21st. There was no vote necessary because the request conformed with the proclamation formerly made.

Mr. Agren's letter asking that the street in the Keefer property on the west of the Lewisville Road be kept open to allow entrance to property along the railroad, was read and the Mayor referred it to the Street and Alley Committee.

Two Soft Drink applications for licenses for the G & S Investment were presented for Ray's Drive Inn and also one for the Duchess at 345 Park Avenue. It was moved by Rogers and seconded by Freeman that the applications be granted and the Clerk authorized to issue the proper licenses. Roll call voting Aye; 4, Nay, None.

A letter presented by D.A.V., V.F.W., and American Legion was read by the Clerk requesting that the name of "Veteran's Memorial Park and Victory Memorial Park" be considered by the City as names for the park on Memorial Drive. The Mayor referred the matter to the Committee on parks.

Leonard Hall of the Building & Construction Trades Council presented a petition and read at length a request for the reinstatement of slot machines in the City. Mr. Freeman suggested that the letter and petition be referred to the Mayor and Council for further consideration, after which the matter was referred as suggested.

Frank Keefer came before the Council again with his request on closing the streets and alleys in the City in Mayflower Addition where Mr. Keefer owns the property. He was advised that the matter had already been taken under advisement.

Ford Johnson submitted the following proposed ordinance:

"AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE A SELF-SERVICE FILLING STATION; DEFINING THE TERM "SELF-SERVICE" AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF"

Dan Piper appeared opposing the ordinance. Also V. W. Haliday commented in favor of the ordinance. The Mayor requested Council study the proposed ordinance which is to be considered at the Meeting of June 6, 1950.

The Mayor presented a statement showing the cost to the City for installing water connections for $\frac{3}{4}$ inch and 1 inch lines after which it was moved by Corbett and seconded by Freeman that the City charge \$30.00 for $\frac{3}{4}$ inch and \$35.00 for 1 inch water connections. These rates to be effective at once. Roll call voting Aye, 4; Nay, None.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Rogers that the Meeting recess to May 24th at 8 P.M. Roll call voting Aye, 4; voting Nay, None.
