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May 9, 1950 the City Council met in Recessed Session. There being present: Thomas L Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Rogers, Johnson, and Freeman. Not present: Councilman Corbett. Also present: E. A. Owen, City Attorney and Charles H. Williams, City Clerk.
