

MAY 8, 1950

The 8th day of May the City Council met in Recessed Session and there were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Rogers, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. Also present: E. A. Owen, City Attorney and the Clerk, Charles H. Williams. The following proceedings were had:

The question is, "Shall Ordinance No. 684 become a law, the objections of the Mayor to the contrary, notwithstanding?" Upon roll call all Councilmen voted Nay. The Mayor asked if anyone had any business to bring before the Council and Vern Strecker of Benton, Benton & Benton, in company with W. O. It was moved by Freeman and seconded by Corbett that the applications be approved and the Clerk authorized to issue the proper licenses. Roll call voting Aye, 4; Voting Nay, None.

The Mayor brought up the matter of the Fireworks Ordinance which was discussed at length with reference to cap guns and sparklers no change was made.

Mr. Peters, City Purchasing Agent, requested authority to purchase additional water pipe to extend the lines to new additions and also to Central Park. It was moved by Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the request be granted. Roll call voting Aye, 4; voting Nay, None.

Mr. Peter also asked confirmation on orders for new trucks for the Electrical Department and Garbage Department. It was moved by Johnson, seconded by Corbett, that the order be confirmed. Roll call voting Aye, 4; voting Nay, None.

The contract on the Airport lease came up before the Council for discussion and it was agreed that the City should not furnish electricity for the café in the hangar building which has been operated for some time without charge for power.

It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Corbett that the Mayor write a letter to the Lessee requesting that he come in and make proper arrangements on the matter. Roll call voting Aye, 4; voting Nay, None.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Corbett and seconded by Johnson that the Meeting recess to May 9, 1950 at 8:00 P.M. Roll call voting Aye, 4; voting Nay, None.
