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May 3, 1950 the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho met in Recessed Session in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls. Three-fourths of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "Shall the ordinance pass?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 4; Nay, None. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed.

An Ordinance entitled #725,

"AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 15-103 OF THE IDAHO  
FALLS CODE OF 1943, ELIMINATING PENALTY FOR DAMAGING OF  
FIRE HYDRANTS AND AMENDING SECTION 15-104 OF THE IDAHO  
FALLS CODE OF 1943, FIXING A PENALTY FOR INJURY OR DAMAGE  
TO FIRE HYDRANTS OR UNLAWFULLY HAVING POSSESSION OF A  
FIRE WRENCH"

was read at length by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Corbett that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. It was seconded by Councilman Rogers. The question being, "Shall the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be read on three several days be dispensed with?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 4; Nay, None. Three-fourths of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "Shall the ordinance pass?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 4; Nay, None. The majority of all the members of the Council present having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed.

At this time, Mr. Black, City Engineer, requested that the persons requesting platted be admitted to the City be required to show width of sidewalks and streets, and also requested that the plans and plats be submitted to the City Council and Planning Commission for approval before admission.

Mr. Kitchen was requested to draw an ordinance for future discussion.

There was a discussion of the City Ordinances covering crimes in the City after which it was agreed that the new ordinance be made up at this would make the necessary adjustments.

Mr. Sutton requested that Mr. Kitchen draw upon an ordinance restricting persons having their dogs out running at large.

Ordinances affecting the Sanitary Department in the City were also discussed.

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The Civil Service having had exams taken for Police Patrolmen, the Mayor asked that the Council approve the appointment of William Gray and Jack E. Hansen to the Police Department. It was moved by Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the appointment be approved. Voting Aye, Corbett, Rogers, and Johnson. Freeman was absent.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the Meeting adjourned.
