

APRIL 26, 1950

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in recessed Session this 26th day of April, 1950 at 8:00 P.M. There being present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Rogers, Johnson and Corbett. There being present also: Charles H. Williams, City Clerk and E. A. Owen, City Attorney.

This being the time previously set for opening the bids for the Linden Park Sewer Truck Line, the following bids were opened and read by the Clerk:

The Mayor referred the bids to Mr. Black, City Engineer, and the Light and Water Departments to be checked over.

Harvey Oswald requested that the City appropriate \$200.00 to the shooting range to pay the lease. It was brought out that the Police patrolmen of the City would use the range for shooting practice and after discussion of the matter, it was moved by Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the City pay \$100.00 on the lease in consideration of the use by the Police Department. Roll call voting Aye; Corbett, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. The motion carried.

A representative of the Occidental Life Insurance Company came before the Council and recommended additional coverage on the City employees Health and Accident Policy. After a discussion of the proposal it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the Mayor be authorized to sign the contract for the additional coverage.
