

APRIL 19, 1950

The City Council of Idaho Falls, Idaho met in Special Session this 19th day of April 1950 at 8:00 P.M. There were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Rogers, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett; Charles H. Williams, City Clerk and E. A. Owen, City Attorney. When the following proceedings were had:

CALL FOR SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS BY

I, Thomas L. Sutton, the duly elected and qualified Mayor of the City of Idaho Falls, under and by virtue of the authority granted to me under Section 50-324 of the Idaho Code and the ordinances of the City of Idaho Falls do hereby call the Council of said City of Idaho Falls into a Special Meeting to be held in the Council Room at the City Hall on Wednesday April 19, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of considering matters relating to the re-codification of the ordinances of the City of Idaho Falls and particularly for the consideration of ordinances dealing with the following matters:

An ordinance providing for revision, codification and compilation in book form of all the ordinances of the City of Idaho Falls under authority of Title 50, Chapter 5 of the Idaho Code.

An ordinance designing and adopting a corporate seal for the City of Idaho Falls.

An ordinance repealing Title 19, Chapter 1 of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943, relating to air raids.

An ordinance amending certain sections of the criminal provisions of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 to make the penalty for violation thereof to conform to the state law and repealing certain sections of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 which deal with restrictions on the sale of alcoholic beverages and are obsolete, and repealing Sections 5-2203 and 5-2204 of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 which sections prohibit marathon dances.

An ordinance fixing punishment for offenses under City ordinances where punishment is not prescribed in such ordinances.

An ordinance amending Chapter 3 of Title 1 of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 providing for the veto power of the Mayor and the passage of ordinances over the Mayor's veto.

An ordinance authorizing the condemnation of dangerous trees in parking areas and providing for their removal.

An ordinance prohibiting the possession, sale, gift or discharge of firecrackers or fireworks in the City of Idaho Falls and repealing Chapter 7 of Title 3 of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 to make such regulations conform to the state law.

An ordinance creating a Civil Service Commission providing for the appointment of the personnel of the same and fixing its powers and duties.

An ordinance amending Section 1-403 of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 to clarify errors in said section regarding the issuance of warrants.

An ordinance amending Section 1-602 of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 regarding the powers and duties of the Mayor.

An ordinance providing for the appointment of election officials in the City of Idaho Falls.

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An ordinance amending Section 3-303 of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 fixing the license fee for the retail sale of beer.

An ordinance amending certain sections of the Idaho Falls Code of 1943 regarding calls for Special Meetings of the Council, limits of Meetings, providing for appointment of president of the Council and setting forth what committees shall be appointed from the members of the Council.

An ordinance providing for the repair and construction of sidewalks, curbs, gutters, or curbs and gutters and parking, within the City of Idaho Falls.

An ordinance establishing the base point for surveys and grades within the City of Idaho Falls.

An ordinance prohibiting the issuance of a license for Slot Machines after July 1, 1950.

And such other ordinances dealing with the re-codification as may be drawn and properly presented to the Council.

"AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REPAIR AND CONSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALKS, CURBS, GUTTERS, OR CURBS AND GUTTERS AND PARKING, WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; PROVIDING FOR RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS FOR SUCH CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR; AUTHORIZING THE CITY COUNCIL TO ORDER SUCH CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR; PROVIDING FOR CONTENTS OF ORDER FOR CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR AND NOTICE OF SAME BY CITY CLERK, AND MANNER OF SERVICE OF SUCH NOTICE, REQUIRING THE COUNCIL TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS WHEN WORK IS NOT DONE WITHIN THE TIME GIVEN IN THE NOTICE; AND PROVIDING THAT WHERE UNSATISFACTORY BIDS ARE RECEIVED THE SAME MAY BE CONSTRUCTED BY THE CITY UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE CITY ENGINEER; FIXING THE MANNER FOR THE COLLECTION OF COSTS FOR SUCH REPAIR AND CONSTRUCTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNCIL TO EXTEND THE TIME FOR SUCH REPAIR AND CONSTRUCTION; PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF LINE AND GRADE FOR SUCH REPAIR AND CONSTRUCTION; CHARGING THE CITY ENGINEER WITH THE SUPERVISION OF SUCH REPAIR AND CONSTRUCTION; PROVIDING THAT NONCONFORMITY TO ORDINANCE IN WORK DONE IN SUCH REPAIR AND CONSTRUCTION SHALL AUTHORIZE THE CITY TO REBUILD OR REPAIR THE SAME AT THE OWNERS' EXPENSE; FIXING STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR SIDEWALKS, CURBS, GUTTERS, OR CURBS AND GUTTER AND DRIVEWAYS OF CONCRETE; PROVIDING THAT A PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO CUT CURB; FIXING A PENALTY FOR

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VIOLATION AND A PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO CONFORM WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND REPEALING SECTION 10-101 TO 10-124, BOTH INCLUSIVE, OF THE IDAHO FALLS CODE OF 1943."

was read at length by the Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Johnson that the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Code, requiring all ordinances to be fully and distinctly read on three several days be dispensed with. It was seconded by Corbett. The question being, "Shall the provisions of Section 50-2004 of the Idaho Coe, requiring all ordinances to be read on three several days be dispensed with?" Roll call resulted as follows: Ayes, 4; Nays, None. Three-fourths of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the rule dispensed with and ordered the ordinance placed before the Council for final consideration, the question being, "Shall the ordinance pass?" Roll call as follows: Ayes, 4; Nay, None. The majority of all the members of the Council having voted in the affirmative, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed.

"AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 594, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 607, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 616, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 622, FIXING THE LICENSE FEES FOR THE OPERATION OF COIN OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICES, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 596, SUCH REPEAL TO BE EFFECTIVE AS OF JULY 1, 1950, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE ANY COIN OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICE AS DEFINED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 50-1502 OF THE IDAHO CODE, WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, AFTER JUNE 30, 1950."

was read at length by the Clerk. There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Rogers and seconded by Johnson that the Meeting adjourn. All Councilmen present voted in favor of the motion. Passed and approved this 8th day of May, 1950.
