

**FEBRUARY 17, 1950**

---

The City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, State of Idaho, met in Regular Session February 17<sup>th</sup>, 1950, at 8:00 P.M., in the City Council Chambers. There was present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Johnson, Corbett and Rogers. Also Charles H. Williams, City Clerk, and E. O. Owen, City Attorney.

The minutes of February 7, 1950, were read by the Clerk after which it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the same be approved. The Council voted unanimously the approval.

At this time the Mayor asked if anyone present had any business to bring before the Council and A. S. Bodily presented the plot plan of the second division of Bel-Aire Addition and requested that it be admitted to the City. There was some discussion after which the plans were left for study by the Mayor and Council.

At this time, Mr. Chesbro, representing a group of businessmen, presented proposal to purchase a section of land south of the railroad and east of Chamberlain Avenue, in Idaho Falls, which they asked the City to rent from them for \$500.00 per month for approximately 10 years at which time the property was to become the property of the City. This property to be repaired by the City, at City expense, for a parking lot with meters installed and the City take the proceeds. It was also suggested that the meters be 3 hour meters. It was estimated by Mr. Chesbro that the land under consideration would park about 150 cars.

It was recommended by the Mayor that papers be drawn up by their attorney and presented to the City Attorney for his approval after which the matter would be acted upon.

J. C. Westergard living in the 700 block on J Street came before the Council and asked when he could expect to have the connection made on the sewer which has been promised for several years. The Mayor advised Mr. Westergard that this connection would be made during 1950.

**RESOLUTION**

“I move the ordinance concerning advertising signs to be placed on our municipally owned parking meters, and which ordinance has passed its first and second readings before this City Council, be rejected in its entirety and permission to erect such advertising be refused.” I make this motion in the interest of public good and because of over whelming opposition to such advertising on municipally owned property. The motion was seconded by Johnson and roll call voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett. The motion carried.
