

JANUARY 20, 1950

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Session in the City Council Chambers. The Mayor Thomas L. Sutton, and Councilmen Russell A. Freeman, Vernon S. Johnson, Ross Corbett and John Rogers were all present and also E. A. Owen, City Attorney and Charles H. Williams, City Clerk.

The minutes of January 6, 1950 were read and the Mayor requested the minutes be corrected with reference to the appointments to show Charbonneau appointed acting Chief of Police. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Corbett, that the minutes be approved as corrected. Roll call voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett. The motion carried.

The monthly report of the Meat Inspector Department was read and it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the report be approved. Roll call voting Aye; Freeman, Corbett, Rogers and Johnson. The motion carried.

The applications of Millard's Do Nut Shop, First Street Confectionary and The Topper Club for PUNCH BOARD LICENSES were presented and it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Rogers that the applications be granted. Roll call voting Aye; Freeman, Corbett, Rogers, and Johnson. The motion carried.

Applications for 28 SOFT DRINK LICENSES were presented and also 3 BARTENDER PERMITS and it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Corbett, that the licenses be issued. Roll call voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, Corbett, and Rogers. The motion carried.

The Mayor presented the Idaho Falls Baseball Club contract and asked permission to sign the same after the approval of the contract by Mr. Owen, City Attorney. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Johnson, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the contract. Roll call voting Aye; Corbett, Rogers, Johnson, and Freeman. The motion carried.

A pipe line lease No. 14362 between the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company and the City of Idaho Falls was presented and it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the Mayor be authorized to sign the same. Roll call voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett. The motion carried.

A plat known as the Hughes Imperial Estates Addition was presented by Mr. Sorenson to be passed on for admission to the City of Idaho Falls. After considerable discussion the matter was taken under advisement.

A plat east of the Idaho Canal and south of Ninth Street, and east of Division Avenue and west of the Idaho Canal was presented and also a plat known as Hill Crest Addition by D. M. Sweeney was presented for admission to the City. These proposals were all taken under advisement.

A letter from the Bonding Company referring to the \$550,000.00 Bond Issue was read by E. A. Owen requesting fixing of the maturities on the bonds. It was agreed by the Mayor and Council that the City Attorney should write the Bonding Company and have the dates of payment on the bonds fixed over a 15 year period.

There being no further business to come before the Council, it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye; Freeman, Corbett, Rogers, and Johnson.
