

JANUARY 6, 1950

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls met in Regular Session in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, Idaho the 6th day of January, 1950. Roll call showed the Mayor and all Councilmen present. The minutes of the Meeting held December 16, 1949 were read and it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Rogers that they be approved. Roll call voting Aye; Corbett, Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. The motion carried.

The annual report of Bart C. Brown, Fire Chief, and the annual report of Hy Hansen, Electrical Inspector, were read and also the monthly reports of the various City Departments after which it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Freeman that they be approved. Roll call voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. The motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO. 643

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE BY THE PROPERTY OWNER OF A BACKWATER AND GAS VALVE IN THE SEWER CONNECTION TO ANY RESIDENCE HEREAFTER CONSTRUCTED IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, AND REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF A BACKWATER AND GAS VALVE IN THE SEWER CONNECTION OF ANY RESIDENCE, BUSINESS OR INDUSTRIAL STRUCTURE OR BUILDING WHEN THE SUPERINTENDENT OF WATER WORKS DEEMS SUCH INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF SAID VALVE NECESSARY FOR THE PROTECTION OF PROPERTY OR IN THE INTEREST OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

The foregoing ordinance was read on the third and final reading after which it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Johnson that the proposed ordinance be passed on the final reading. Roll call voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, Corbett, and Rogers. The Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho is the legal owner and in possession of Lots 1, 2, 3, 10, 11, and 12, in Block 50 of the Original Town of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho according to the recorded plat thereof, and

WHEREAS, the above described Lots have heretofore been appraised by three disinterested freeholders of the City, selected by the Council, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, that the above described real property be sold at public auction to the highest bidder, after public notice thereof for at least ten days in the official paper of said City, provided, that no bids shall be accepted for less than the appraised value, and, provided further, that the Council may reject any and all bids as in such case made and provided by law.
