August 19, 1949 Council Meeting of the Mayor and City Council of Idaho Falls convened in the Council Chambers at 8:00 P.M. There were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Charles H. Williams, City Clerk and Councilmen Corbett, Crabtree, Johnson and Freeman.

The minutes of the Meeting held August 5, and the Recessed Meeting of August 8, were read and one correction made, it was then moved by Johnson and seconded by Freeman, that the minutes be approved. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

D. F. Mauer, R. F. Woller and Jay V. Trowbridge each appeared in person and registered complaints as to the sanitary conditions in the neighborhood of the 900 and 1000 blocks on Cassia Avenue and made verbal requests for the installation of the sewer.

The Mayor advised these gentlemen that there would be a Bond Company man in town in the near future and the matter of sewer would be discussed with him.

Jack A. Packer representing the Junior Chamber of Commerce requested permission to have the subscriptions to the proposed swimming pool collected by the City Clerk's office along with the regular monthly light and water bills. The Mayor asked E. A. Owen, City Attorney, his opinion as to the legal aspect. Mr. Owen stated that he could see no reason why the funds could not be collected by the City Clerk because it is a public project and will be turned to the City when completed.

The Mayor asked the Council to make a motion authorizing the City Clerk to work with the Junior Chamber of Commerce in the collection of the funds.

It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Corbett, that the Clerk be authorized to collect the pledges obtained by the Junior Chamber of Commerce from light and water users of the City along with the regular monthly light and water bills. Roll call, Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, Corbett, and Crabtree. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

Charles V. King representing Robert F. Johnson & Associates, Inc. of Portland, Oregon appeared before the Council and asked that the City extend its water lines to the City limits east of the Golf Course as his Company is planning to build a large number of dwelling houses; some for sale and some for rental purposes. It was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that the City extend the water mains to the City limits and make the necessary water supply available for the project when the buildings need the water. Voting Aye; Corbett, Crabtree, Johnson, and Freeman. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The meat inspection report for the month of July was submitted and also the report of the Building Inspector on twenty building permits was submitted. It was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that they be approved. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett. The motion carried.

It was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that the applications be granted and the Clerk authorized to issue the permits. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

It was moved by Johnson and seconded by Corbett, that the applications be granted and the Clerk directed to issue the Slot Machine Licenses. Roll call, Voting Aye; Freeman, Corbett, Crabtree, and Johnson. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The matter of price of cemetery lots and spaces was brought before the City Council and it was discussed and compared with other cities and was then continued for further study.

George W. Sudbury appeared for the Lund Machinery Company and proposed to the City that they purchase additional thawing equipment. This matter was referred to the Committee on streets and the Street Commissioner.

There being two letters presented requesting the removal of Slot Machines the Clerk read them, one from the First Baptist Church signed by C. R. Black, Moderator and the second one from the Woman's Christian Temperance Union. This second letter was signed by Mrs. George Brater, President and Mrs. Clarence Owen, Secretary.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Crabtree and seconded by Johnson, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Freeman, Corbett, and Johnson.
