

AUGUST 5, 1949

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, convened in the Council Chambers August 5, 1949 at 8:30 P.M. There were present: Freeman, Corbett, Johnson, and Crabtree. Also present: Charles H. Williams, City Clerk. Mayor Sutton being absent, Councilman Freeman presided over the Meeting.

Minutes of the Meetings of July 15, and July 18, were read and it was moved by Johnson, seconded by Corbett, that the minutes be approved as read. Voting Aye; Freeman, Corbett, Crabtree and Johnson. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

A. W. Brunt came before the City Council and presented a plat prepared by C. R. Black, Engineer and this plat was accompanied by a deed of dedication, the new addition to be know as Willowbrook Addition to the City of Idaho Falls. The plat was looked over by the Council and it was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that the new addition be accepted subject to reservations for utility rights of way. Roll call, Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, Corbett, and Crabtree. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

In response to publications three bids were filed with the Clerk covering the special improvements for Improvement District #21. They were opened at this time as follows:

Mr. Freeman referred these bids to the Engineering Department and the Council to be studied, with the understanding that the bids would be let Aug. 8, 1949 at 8:00 P.M., recessed Meeting.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Johnson, that the monthly bills be approved and the Clerk authorized to draw warrants on the proper funds in payment of the same. Roll call, Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, Corbett and Crabtree.

The monthly reports of the various Departments were read by the Clerk and were considered by the Council. It was suggested by Mr. Freeman that a comparison of the reports on garbage removal be made to see if the new compactor unit was saving the City anything.

The plan for extension of the tool building at Rosehill Cemetery was presented with a bid of \$2,509.00 for the construction submitted by Heyrend Construction Co. It was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that Heyrend be authorized to construct the addition. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

It was recommended by Mr. Freeman, that the City install two new boilers at the Airport. One for the Hangar and one for the Administration Building, as the old boiler is burned beyond repair. The First Street Plumbing and Heating Co. submitted the price of \$645.40 for each boiler delivered in Idaho Falls. It was moved by Corbett, seconded by Johnson, that the boilers be purchased. Voting Aye; Freeman, Corbett, Crabtree, and Johnson. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The application of Carsie McDowell for exemption on light and water was presented with the recommendation and report of W. F. Nicole that the application be granted. It was agreeable to the members of the Council that the exemption be granted temporarily.

The application of Elizabeth Andrus for light and water exception was presented, with the report of W. F. Nichol and his recommendation that she be granted exemption. This application was tabled for the Mayor to check into.

A letter of the Council of Church Women of Idaho Falls was read by the Clerk, which ask that Slot Machines be abolished in Idaho Falls. This letter was ordered tabled.

It was moved by Crabtree and seconded by Corbett, that the above licenses be granted. Roll call, Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, Corbett, and Crabtree. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

An agreement drawn up by the Utah Power & Light Company in which it was set out that the City of Idaho Falls and the Utah Power and Light Company use the same utility poles for a short distance where it is necessary to have the two lines along the same road, was presented to the Council. It was discussed after which it was moved by Corbett, seconded by Johnson, that the Agreement be accepted subject to the approval of E. A. Owen, City Attorney. Roll call, Voting Aye; Corbett, Crabtree, Johnson and Freeman. The voting was unanimous, the motion carried.

The ordinance governing the planting of trees on the street parking in Idaho Falls was again read by the Clerk and it was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Johnson, that the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading. Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett. The voting was unanimous, the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Johnson, seconded by Corbett, that Council Meeting recess to August 8, 1949 at 8:00 P.M.
