

JULY 18, 1949

The Recessed Meeting of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho convened in the Council Chambers July 18, 1949 at 8:00 P.M. There were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Charles H. Williams, City Clerk; Councilmen Corbett, Johnson, Freeman. Councilman Crabtree was absent.

The Idaho Livestock Auction Co. appeared and protested the paving of North Emerson Avenue from the north side of North Yellowstone Boulevard to existing concrete ramp, and also protested curb and sidewalk on the same location.

Leslie Lingren protested the special improvements proposed by Special Improvement Dist. #21 on the corner of Willow Avenue and L Street adjacent to Lots 9 to 12, Block B of Elg Addition.

Wilford Widistene appeared and requested that when the sidewalk is installed on Clark Street it be placed at the curb. This was agreed to.

It was also requested the improvement proposed on Pine Street be left out for one block on the east end.

ORDINANCE NO. 631

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF CREATING LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 21 IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO AND OF MAKING LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS THEREIN, EXCLUSIVE OF THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF IMPROVEMENTS WITHIN STREET INTERSECTIONS, BY INSTALLMENTS PAYABLE IN TEN EQUAL ANNUAL PAYMENTS AS NEARLY AS MAY BE, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF LOCAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT IN THE NAME OF SAID MUNICIPALITY FOR SAID INSTALLMENTS, AND FIXING THE RATE OF INTEREST THEY SHALL BEAR AND MAKING THE SAME PAYABLE ANNUALLY; AND PROVIDING HOW AND BY WHOM CONTRACT FOR MAKING SAID IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE MADE.

The foregoing proposed ordinance was read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Johnson, seconded by Corbett, that it be passed on its first reading. Roll call, Voting Aye; Freeman, Corbett, and Johnson. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

It was moved by Freeman that the rule requiring an ordinance to be read at three Meetings be suspended and the ordinance be placed on its second and third readings, seconded by Corbett. Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, and Corbett. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The ordinance was again read by the Clerk and it was moved by Corbett and seconded by Johnson that the ordinance pass on the second reading. Voting Aye; Freeman, Corbett, and Johnson, Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The following petition was submitted:

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PETITION

We, the undersigned property owners and residents within the neighborhood of the corner of Shoup Avenue and G. Street, hereby represent to the Honorable Mayor and Council of the City of Idaho Falls; that one Dean Farrer, as a tenant of Wallace A. Sayer, has installed a root beer and hamburger stand on Shoup Avenue between F and G Streets, and has imported and spread about the stand a surface layer of ground pumice stone, without oil or other bonding material to hold it in place; that the pumice is continually being pulverized by the cars driven by patrons of said stand; and that the pulverized pumice is then picked up by every breeze or current of air and blown into the homes of the undersigned residents in the vicinity; that the presence of the stand as thus maintained and the pumice laden air created thereby constitutes and is a public nuisance and your petitioners therefore request that your Honorable Body abate said nuisance, or cause same to be abated forthwith, that we may enjoy our homes and property as heretofore:

RESOLUTION REVISING AND CORRECTING ASSESSMENT ROLL
OF LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 12 AND CONFIRMING
SUCH ASSESSMENT ROLL AS CORRECTED

WHEREAS, the City Engineer and Committee on Streets have heretofore made out and certified to the City Council as provided by law an assessment roll of Local Improvement District 21, and;

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WHEREAS, on July 1, 1949, the City Council fixed the time and place when and where objections to said Assessment Roll by the property owners of said District would be heard, to-wit; Monday, the 18th day of July, 1949, at eight o'clock P.M. of said day at the Council Chambers in the City Building at Idaho Falls, Idaho, and;

WHEREAS, notice was duly and regularly given as provided by law by the Clerk of the time to file objections to said Assessment Roll, and

WHEREAS, the owners of the following described property now included in said Assessment Roll situate in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, have requested that the assessment against said property and the whole thereof be set aside and vacated and that said property and the whole thereof, be eliminated from said Assessment Roll, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has examined said Assessment Roll and has heard and considered said objections, and

WHEREAS, no other objections of any kind or nature were filed or made to said Assessment Roll, and

WHEREAS, the City Council after considering said objections has determined that said property described in said objections, and hereinafter described, and the whole thereof, should be eliminated from said Assessment Roll, and said assessments thereon set aside and vacated.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that said assessments on the following described property, to-wit:

Lots Twenty-five (25) to Twenty-nine (29) inclusive, in Block Five (5) Capitol Hill Addition, Lots Four (4) to Nine (9) inclusive, in Block Forty-one (41) of the Original Town-site of Eagle Rock, Lots Forty (40) to Forty-Six (46) inclusive, Block Four (4) of Dwight's Addition, Lots One (1) to Seven (7) inclusive, and Lots Thirty-eight (38) to Forty-five (45) inclusive, in Block Five (5) of Dwight's Addition.

shall be, and hereby are set aside and vacated and that otherwise, and as to all other property described in said Assessment Roll, and each and every item thereof, and the whole thereof, except the property above described, be, and the same hereby is, in all respects approved and confirmed.
