

JULY 15, 1949

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, convened in the Council Chambers July 15, 1949 at 8:00 P.M. There were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Charles H. Williams, City Clerk; Councilmen Crabtree, Johnson, and Freeman. Councilman Corbett was absent.

The minutes of the Council Meeting held July 7, were read and corrected after which they were approved, on a motion made by Johnson and seconded by Crabtree. Roll call, Voting Aye; Freeman, Crabtree, and Johnson. Voting Nay; None. Corbett Absent. The motion carried.

It was recommended by the Mayor that the bids submitted on July 7, for gravel all be rejected. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Johnson, that the Mayor's recommendation be approved and all bids for gravel presented July 7, 1949 be rejected. Roll call, Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, and Crabtree. Voting Nay; None. Corbett Absent. The motion carried.

The following application for licenses were presented:

PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE MAYOR AND COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO:

The undersigned respectfully represent and show that they are industrial and residential property owners and residents in the City of Idaho Falls and Bonneville County, Idaho, and the property lies between South Utah Avenue, and adjacent to New Sweden Road, and Snake River.

We, the undersigned, hereby petition and respectfully request the above named governing authority of the City of Idaho Falls to extend the City water supply for potential industrial use and for domestic use from the point where it is now on south Utah Avenue, and from the proposed southern extension (designated as line "A" to "B" on the hereto attached map), at the point indicated by a point designated as "C" to the vicinity of the point indicated and designated as point "D" on the attached map.

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This petition and request is made for the reason that the included industrial area is evident as a drawing interest to more industrial business in the City, the water supply would also serve residential and other community interest, and they are unable to obtain other suitable water for their use without great expense which would be incurred in digging wells.

The Mayor referred the above petition to Councilman Johnson and the Water Works Department.

In response to a letter from Jay Painter, Bonneville County Engineer, C. R. Black, City Engineer submitted a proposal requesting that the City join with the County in improving the Airport Road, at a cost to the City of \$8,676.25; New Sweden Road south at edge of City limits at a cost of \$4,360.00; South Boulevard to City Park entrance at a cost to the City of \$1,351.60. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the City approve the proposal and join with the County in the street improvements. Roll call, Voting Aye; Freeman, Crabtree, and Johnson, Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

After due consideration of the applications of the National Guard and the D.A.V. for the use of Armory for boxing and wrestling matches, it was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that the National Guard be given permission to use the building. Roll call, Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, and Crabtree. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO. 630

AN ORDINANCE VACATING AND CLOSING MILL STREET BETWEEN BLOCKS FORTY-ONE (41) AND SIXTY-EIGHT (68), THE ALLEY IN BLOCK SIXTY-EIGHT (68) AND THE SNAKE RIVER, ALL IN HIGHLAND PARK ADDITION TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE USE OF THE OWNERS OF THE ADJACENT REAL ESTATE, AS PROVIDED BY LAW.

After reading the ordinance by the Clerk it was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that it be passed on its first reading. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, and Freeman. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

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It was moved by Crabtree that the rule requiring an ordinance to be read at three meetings be suspended and the ordinance be placed on its second and third readings, this motion was seconded by Freeman. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, and Freeman. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The ordinance was then again read by the Clerk and it was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the ordinance pass on the second reading. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson and Freeman. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The ordinance was then read the third time by the Clerk and it was moved by Crabtree and seconded by Johnson, that the ordinance pass on its third and final reading and the Clerk be instructed to publish the same as provided by law and charge the costs to Keefer and Rushton. Roll call, Voting Aye; Freeman, Crabtree and Johnson. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

An easement was presented to the Council in which the City of Idaho Falls is given permission to cross certain land belonging to Jack Scheets with a roadway for a period of 90 days. It was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that the Easement be approved. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, and Freeman. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The matter of the Order to Show Cause why the license of the West Broadway should not be revoked was again brought before the Council by the Mayor. Mr. Naylor appeared in behalf of Mr. Adair, the operator of the Club, and asked that the license not be revoked. Also Mr. McGinty and Surge Marshall each appeared in behalf of Mr. Adair. After considerable discussion for and against in this case the Mayor requested the Council to revoke the license. After due consideration it was moved by Freeman, seconded by Johnson, that the license of the West Broadway Club be suspended for 30 days with the recommendation that if the law is violated after the Club is permitted to open, the license will be revoked. Roll call, Voting Aye; Crabtree, Johnson, and Freeman. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

A proposal by Mr. McCallum on the sale of property adjoining the Public Library was discussed by the Mayor and members of the Council and it was decided that the price asked for the property was too high.

Jimmy Dunn came before the Council with some new parking meters which were adjustable as to time and also some intersection markers which were favorably considered by the Mayor and Council and it was decided to order enough to try them out.

The Fire Chief and Building Inspector reported to the Council on the findings they had made on fire prevention in localities of Gas and Oil storage tanks. The National regulations were presented and discussed after which it was moved by Johnson, seconded by Crabtree, that there being no further business to come before the Council it recess to July 18, 1949 at 8:00 P.M.

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
