

OCTOBER 21, 1949

October 21, 1949, the City Council met in Regular Session in the Council Chambers at Idaho Falls, at 7:30 P.M. There were present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Johnson, and Rogers. Councilman Corbett was absent. Charles H. Williams, City Clerk was present and read the minutes of the previous Meeting and after one correction it was moved by Johnson, seconded by Freeman, that the minutes be approved. Roll call, Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, and Rogers. The motion carried.

The Mayor asked if anyone had anything to bring before the Council before taking up the regular business. L. E. Andelin and Floyd Heyrend asked about the new zoning ordinance and the Mayor advised them that there is still thirty days before the final reading at which time the ordinance will be studied page by page and amendments will be made. However he asked that they make their request for amendments in writing.

The petition of L. E. Andelin to change the zoning ordinance was read and it was held for the next reading.

The petition of J. W. Jensen was read requesting permission to connect to the City water line on Anderson Avenue and it was referred to the Light and Water Committee and Mr. Black to be reported on at the next Meeting.

A letter from the South Idaho Falls Stake Relief Society on the Slot Machines issue was read and held on file by the Clerk.

An application for a DANCE HALL license by H. H. Merrill was presented by the Clerk. The application was for a quarterly license and was accompanied by a \$25.00 fee. This application was referred to the Police Committee and the City Attorney E. A. Oxen.

Application of Paul D. Fisher for a BARTENDER'S permit was presented and it was moved by Freeman, seconded by Johnson, that it be granted. Roll call, Voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson, and Freeman. The motion carried.

ZONING ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE FOR ZONING THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS TO
REGULATE THE LOCATION, SIZE, USE AND HEIGHT OF BUILDINGS
HEREAFTER ERECTED OR ALTERED, THE ARRANGEMENT OF

BUILDINGS ON LOTS, AND THE DENSITY OF POPULATION WITHIN THE CITY, AND FOR SAID PURPOSES, TO DIVIDE THE CITY INTO DISTRICTS, PRESCRIBE FOR VIOLATIONS OF ITS PROVISIONS, AND TO PROVIDE FOR ITS ENFORCEMENT; SUCH REGULATION BEING NECESSARY FOR THE GENERAL WELFARE OF THE COMMUNITY.

The foregoing ordinance was presented and it was moved by Freeman, seconded by Johnson, that it pass on its second reading. Roll call, Voting Aye; Freeman, Rogers, and Johnson. The motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE VI, CHAPTER 4, IDAHO FALLS CODE OF 1943 RELATING TO INCINERATORS, GARBAGE AND TRASH CONTAINERS, RACKS, AND TO THE BURNING OF PAPER AND DRY RUBBISH: BY AMENDING SECTIONS 6-401 AND 6-402, AND ADDING SECTIONS 6-404, 6-405, AND 6-406.

The foregoing ordinance was read and it was moved by Freeman, seconded by Johnson, that it be passed on its second reading. Roll call, Voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, and Rogers. The motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A MINIMUM READY-TO-SERVE CHARGE FOR METERED INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF WATER METERS BY THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN WAREHOUSES AND INDUSTRIAL PLANTS WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS AND FOR THE USERS OF CITY WATER OUTSIDE THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; FIXING A MINIMUM AND GRADUATED CHARGE FOR EACH ONE THOUSAND GALLONS OF WATER USED AND THE METHOD FOR PAYMENT OF CHARGES MADE; PROVIDING FOR CITY SERVICE CONNECTION FOR LAWN AND SHRUBBERY SPRINKLING SYSTEMS EXCLUSIVELY.

The foregoing ordinance was read and it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Rogers, that it be passed on its second reading. Roll call, Voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson and Freeman. The motion carried.

E. A. Owen, City Attorney advised the Mayor and members of the Council that upon petition the U. S. Government is transferring Veteran's Housing Units over to cities and also the educational institutions to be administered by them. After hearing the discussion it was moved by Johnson and seconded by Rogers, that Mr. Owen be authorized to prepare a resolution to be sent to the

Government after passage by the City Council. Roll call, Voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson, and Freeman. The motion carried.

The Mayor appointed the following Committees:

Parks, Cemetery and Golf Course:	Russell A. Freeman and Ross Corbett
Police, Sanitation, Building and Fire:	Vernon S. Johnson and John Rogers

John Sharp appeared for the Bair Tire Shop and requested permission to install a 10,000 gallon gas tank at the shop on the corner of Cliff Street and Chamberlain Avenue. The Mayor advised Mr. Sharp that he would take the matter up with the Building Inspector and advise him at a later date.

There being no further business to come before the Council, it was moved by Freeman, seconded by Johnson, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call, Voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson and Freeman, The motion carried.
