

DECEMBER 7, 1949

The City Council met December 7, 1949 in Regular Session at 8:00 P.M., in the Council Chambers. There being present: Thomas L. Sutton, Mayor; Councilmen Freeman, Corbett, and Johnson and Charles H. Williams, City Clerk.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting held November 18, and the Special Meeting held November 28, were read, two correction were made after which it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Corbett that the minutes be approved as corrected. Roll call voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, Corbett, and Rogers. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE BY THE PROPERTY OWNER OF A BACK WATER AND GAS VALVE IN THE SEWER CONNECTION TO ANY RESIDENCE HEREAFTER CONSTRUCTED IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS AND REQUIRING INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF A BACKWATER AND GAS VALVE IN THE SEWER CONNECTION OF ANY RESIDENCE, BUSINESS OR INDUSTRIAL STRUCTURE OR BUILDING WHEN THE SUPERINTENDENT OF WATER WORKS DEEMS SUCH INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF SAID VALVE NECESSARY FOR THE PROTECTION OR IN THE INTEREST OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

The above captioned ordinance was read by the clerk on the second reading and it was moved by Freeman and seconded by Corbett that it be passed on the second reading. Roll call voting Aye; Corbett, Rogers, Freeman and Johnson. The motion carried.

A letter received from Carl Kitchen on the re-codifying the City Ordinances was read and it was referred to the Mayor and City Attorney.

A proposed resolution was read by Mr. Owen, City Attorney, with reference to the widening of and curbing and guttering of Ninth Street, to the Linden Park Addition. This resolution was not acceptable and it was referred to Mr. Owen to answer.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, heretofore Linden Park Addition has been made a part of the City, and the needs thereof require the extension of certain utilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the six inch water main be extended starting at 11th Street and Division, and extending northerly on Division Avenue to the southeast corner of Linden Park Division, Division No. 1, City of Idaho Falls.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, heretofore Linden Park Addition has been made a part of the city, and the needs thereof require the extension of certain utilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the fifteen inch sewer trunk line that enters the present manhole in the alley between 7th and 8th Streets on Holmes Avenue, be extended and that the same shall run east approximately 1360 feet to the street to be opened on
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the east side of the new high school property; thence running north for approximately 153 feet to 7th Street extended; thence east on 7th Street to Linden Drive in the Linden Park Addition, City of Idaho Falls.

It was moved by Freeman and seconded by Corbett, that the resolution to extend the water main at 11th and Division be approved. Roll call voting Aye; Johnson, Freeman, Corbett, and Rogers. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

It was moved by Corbett and seconded by Rogers that the resolution to extend the sewer between 7th and 8th be approved. Roll call voting Aye; Corbett, Rogers, Johnson, and Freeman. Voting Nay; None. The motion carried.

The Reverend Clark J. Wood, representing the Idaho Falls Ministerial Association, presented a written request for the removal of Slot Machines and made a verbal request to the Mayor and City Council.

The Mayor directed the letter filed with the other letter on the subject.

There being no further business to come before the Council it was moved by Freeman, seconded by Corbett that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye; Rogers, Johnson, Freeman and Corbett. The motion carried.
