The following request was read:

To: The Honorable Mayor and City Council

Gentlemen:

I, Vern L. Brown, request permission to cut through the pavement and dig a hole about 8 to 10 feet square on Market Street for the purpose of installing a steam boiler in my building, located at the corner of Broadway and Capital. This seems the only way of getting the boiler into the basement.

If granted permission all work will be done under your instructions.

Gentlemen:

We propose to establish a new taxi business in Idaho Falls to be known as the Camel Cab Co.

The Company will maintain five new cars (radio controlled) in strict confirmation with City laws and regulations, to be headquartered in the lobby of the Hotel Rogers under the direct supervision of W. G. Campbell, Sr. and W. G. Campbell, Jr., owners and managers of said Hotel. We also desire the use of one parking space (meter) directly in front of Hotel door, the others cars using off street parking.

We are prepared to meet any City requirement such as license, insurance of all types etc. We will maintain 24 hour service with fares equitable to other local cab companies.
