It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up an Ordinance to change the name of "M" Street to Highland Drive. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The following Petition signed by twenty-seven (27) property owners was read.

We, the undersigned property owners of 18<sup>th</sup> Street between Boulevard and Higbee hereby petition the Honorable Mayor and City Council of Idaho Falls to eliminate the parking strips on both sides of the Street as above described.

We feel that a wider Street will be beneficial to all concerned inasmuch as it is extremely hazardous to all persons and especially school children crossing the Street.

No action was taken on the Petition and it was ordered filed until next Spring.

A letter from Robert L. Williams requesting the City to open the alley in Block 72 of Highland Addition was read.

The Mayor referred the letter to the Street Committee.

Lowell Cramer was nominated as Secretary of the Policemen's Retirement Fund by Councilman Crabtree. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that Lowell Cramer be elected as Secretary of the Policemen's Retirement Fund. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The Idaho Falls Gun Club appeared before the City Council, and requested space on the south side of the Municipal Airport to move their shooting range onto North Holmes Avenue. The Mayor appointed the following Committee to investigate the request: Councilmen Wasley, Sutton, and the City Engineer, C. R. Black.

O. B. Wright, Manager of the Old Faithful Beverage Company, appeared before the City Council, and requested to bury the end of a large fuel oil tank under the sidewalk on Maple Street. The Mayor referred the request to the Building Inspector and Street Committee.
