

JUNE 6, 1947

Minutes of a regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held June 6th, 1947, were recorded. There were present at said Meeting: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of the last regular Meeting were read and approved.

The following monthly reports were read and approved: City Clerk, Waterworks Supt., Sanitary & Meat Inspectors, Electrical Inspector, City Electrician, Street & Park Commissioner, Chief of Fire Dept., Plumbing Inspector.

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1947-1948, AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS", was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Freeman, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None. The Ordinance was then numbered 597 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved, and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

The following Resolution was read:

RESOLUTION NO. 1

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, TO GRADE, PRIME COAT, PAVE, CURB, GUTTER, SURFACE DRAIN, AND CONSTRUCT SIDEWALKS ON CERTAIN STREETS AND PARTS OF STREETS, ALLEYS AND PARTS OF ALLEYS WITHIN SAID CITY: TO CREATE LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 20 FOR IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING SAID IMPROVEMENTS; TO DEFRAY THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF SAID DISTRICT AND A PORTION OF THE COST AND EXPENSES OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS BY SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS LEVIED UPON AND AGAINST THE LOTS AND LANDS ABUTTING, ADJOINING, AND ADJACENT TO THE STREET OR STREETS OF ALLEY OR ALLEYS TO BE SO IMPROVED, AND ON AND AGAINST ALL LOTS AND LAND BENEFITED BY SUCH IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDED IN SAID DISTRICT AND TO PAY THE WHOLE COST AND EXPENSES OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS WITHIN STREET INTERSECTIONS AND ALLEY INTERSECTIONS FROM THE GENERAL FUNDS OF THE CITY, AND DECLARING SAID IMPROVEMENTS TO BE AN ORIGINAL IMPROVEMENT OR IMPROVEMENTS; GIVING THE KIND AND CHARACTER OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF: FIXING THE TIME WHEN PROTESTS AGAINST SAID IMPROVEMENTS AND THE CREATION OF SAID DISTRICT MAY BE FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK AND WHEN SUCH PROTESTS WILL BE HEARD AND CONSIDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL; AND PROVIDING FOR GIVING NOTICE THEREOF.

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WHEREAS, the City Council of Idaho Falls, Idaho, deems it for the best interests of the City to grade, gravel, prime coat, pave, curb, gutter, surface drain, and construct sidewalks on certain streets and parts of streets and alleys and parts of alleys within the corporate limits of said City, hereinafter particularly described; and to create Local Improvement District No. 20 for the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, for the purpose of making said improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the estimated total cost of said District and of said improvements is \$58,059.76, of which sum \$12,457.84 is the total estimated cost of said improvements within street and alley intersections; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council is authorized to expend from the General Funds of the City the whole of the cost and expenses of said improvements within street intersections and such other portion of the cost and expenses of said improvements as in their judgment may be fair and equitable in consideration of the benefits accruing to the general public by reason of such improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council proposes to defray the cost and expenses of said District and of said improvement to the extent of \$45,601.92 by special assessments levied upon and against the lots and land abutting, adjoining, and adjacent to the streets and alleys to be so improved, and on and against all lots and lands benefited by such improvements included in said District, and to defray the whole cost and expenses of said improvements within street and alley intersections, from the General Funds of the City, and

NOW, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Idaho Falls, Idaho does hereby declare its intention to grade, gravel, prime coat, pave, gutter, curb, surface drain, and construct sidewalks on certain streets and parts of streets and alleys and parts of alleys within the corporate limits of said City, and for that purpose to create and establish a Local Improvement District therein to be known as Local Improvement District No. 20 for the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, comprising said streets and parts of streets and alleys and parts of alleys and the lots and land abutting, adjoining, and adjacent thereto and the lots and lands benefited by such improvements and situated in said District, which said streets and parts of streets, alleys, and parts of alleys and lots and land are described as follows, to-wit:

Street Paving in Holmes Subdivision

“C” Street, from the West Side of Yellowstone Avenue to the East Side of Park Ave.

Street Paving on Broadway

Broadway (U. S. Highway #91), from the West end of the Snake River Bridge, Northwesterly to the City Limits (2575.9) feet.

Street Paving on River-way Drive

River-way Drive from the North side of Broadway Northeasterly 1,500 feet.

Sidewalk on Broadway

Broadway (U. S. Highway #91), from the West end of the Snake River Bridge, Northwesterly to the City limits (2575.9 feet).

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Lots and Land - Holmes Subdivision

Block 15, Lots 7 to 18, inclusive.
Block 16, Lots 7 to 18, inclusive.
Block 17, Lots 7 to 18, inclusive.
Block 18, Lots 7 to 18, inclusive.

Beginning at the intersection of the North line of Broadway, extended, and the West line of River-way Drive and running thence North 28° 38' East 170 feet, thence Northwesterly, parallel to and 170 feet from the North line of Broadway, extended to the North-South center line through Sections 13 and 24, T. 2 North, Range 37 E. B. M., thence South along said center line to the North line of Broadway extended; thence South along said center line to the North line of Broadway extended; to the point of beginning.

Beginning at a point on the South line of Broadway, extended which is Northwesterly 744 feet from the East line of Capital Avenue, and running thence South 28° 38' East 170 feet, thence Northwesterly parallel to and 170 feet from the South line of Broadway extended to the North-South center line through Section 24, T. 2 North, Range 37 E. B. M., thence North along said center line to the South line of Broadway extended, thence Southeasterly along the South line of Broadway extended to the point of beginning.

Beginning at the intersection of the North line of Broadway and the West bank of the Snake River, and running thence Northwesterly along the North line of Broadway to the West bank of the Porter Canal, thence Northeasterly along the East bank of the Porter Canal, approximately 1,500 feet, to a point West of the Snake River Dam, thence East to the West bank of the Snake River, thence Southwesterly along the West bank of the Snake River to the point of beginning.

Section 2. The kind and character of said improvements are grading, graveling, prime coating, guttering, curbing, paving, surface draining, and constructing sidewalks on said streets and parts of streets and alleys and parts of alleys, all according to the plans and specifications to be filed in the office of the City Engineer and the City Clerk on or before the day fixed for hearing protests against the creation of said District and the making of said improvements.

Section 3. The said improvements are Original.

Section 4. The estimated total cost and expenses of said District and of said improvements are \$58,059.96, which sum is to be allocated and paid as follows:

From Special Assessments	\$45,601.92
From General Funds of the City	12,457.84

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Section 5. The cost and expenses of said District and of said improvements which is to be paid by special assessment is to be assessed against the abutting, adjoining and adjacent lots and lands on the streets or parts of streets and alleys or part of alleys on which said improvements are to be made, and upon lots and lands benefited by such improvements and included within said District, each lot and parcel of land being assessed separately for the debt thereof, in proportion as to the number of square feet of said lots and lands abutting, adjoining, and adjacent thereto or included in said District to the distance back from said streets and parts of streets, if platted in blocks to the center of the blocks, and if platted in lots to the center of the lots and if not platted, to the distance of 125 feet, and in proportion to the benefits derived to such lots and lands by said improvements, sufficient to cover the total cost and expenses of said improvements to the center of the street.

The cost and expenses of said improvements within street and alley intersections, namely the sum of \$12,457.84 is, in the judgment of the City Council, a fair and equitable portion of the total cost and expenses of said District and of said improvements to be expended from the General Funds of the City in consideration of the benefits accruing to the general public by reason of such improvements and shall be paid out of the General Funds of the City.
