WHEREAS, the FPHA has submitted an amendment to said contract to provide for additional temporary dwelling accommodations consisting of ten family dwelling units; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council to cooperate with the Federal Public Housing Authority in obtaining additional housing accommodations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to execute for and in behalf of the City of Idaho Falls, said Amendment to said Contract (FPHA-1481-E).

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1946-1947, AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS" was read in full by the Clerk. Sealed bids will be received by Lee Walker, City Clerk, at the City Building, Idaho Falls, Idaho, until 8:00 o'clock P.M. July 8, 1946, for the construction of the following improvements at the Idaho Falls Municipal Airport, and will then and there be opened and publicly read.

Grading and construction 8,500 square yards of taxi-way and aprons for hangars involving about 1,000 cubic yards of common excavation and fill 1,000 cubic yards of base gravel and 8,500 square yards of two inch asphaltic concrete wearing surface.

Plans, specifications and form of contract documents may be examined at the office of the City Engineer and at the office of the City Clerk, City Building, Idaho Falls, Idaho and a set of plans, specifications and forms may be obtained at the offices of either of the above upon the deposit of \$2.00 payable to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

The full amount of the deposit for one set of documents will be returned to each actual bidder within a reasonable time after receipt of bid. Other deposits will be refunded with deduction not to exceed the actual cost of reproduction of the drawings, upon the return of all documents in good conditions within 30 days after the date of opening bids.

All bidders shall designate the locality, quarry, kiln or factory from which will be furnished the specific material to be used by them, with its commercial designation.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a certified check made payable to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, in the amount not less than 5% of the amount bid.

The City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, reserves the right to reject any and all bids, and to waive informalities.

No bidder may withdraw his bid after the hour set for opening thereof, or before award of contract, unless said award is delayed for a period exceeding 30 days.
