The following letter was read:

To the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho:

The City Planning Commission of Idaho Falls, Idaho, at its Meeting on the 20th day of February, 1946, passed the following motions and submitted them as recommendations to the City Council for your consideration:

That a qualified City Planner be employed for the purpose of developing and submitting a complete plan to govern the future growth of the City of Idaho Falls, that the Commission be empowered to name the City Planner to be employed, that such City Planner submit his plan to the Planning Commission of Idaho Falls for its inspections,

recommendations, revisions, and approval prior to its final submission to the City Council and the City of Idaho Falls for action:

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That the City stop the sale of that property on the west side of the river until the Planning Commission has had sufficient time to consider that property in conjunction with its overall planning for the future growth of the City of Idaho Falls.

WHEREAS, the City Clerk, pursuant to a Resolution duly passed and approved by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls on the 8th day of February, 1946, advertised, as provided by law, the following described real property for sale at public auction, to-wit:

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That the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, be and they hereby are authorized and directed to execute for and in behalf of the City of Idaho Falls a written contract (form 1481) with the Federal Public Housing Authority to provide temporary housing in the City of Idaho Falls, pursuant to Title V (as amended) of the Laneham Act, upon such terms and for such number of housing units as to the Mayor of the City of Idaho Falls may seem advisable.

An Ordinance entitled, AN ORDINANCE VACATING AND CLOSING A CERTAIN PORTION OF POULSON STREET IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE USE OF THE OWNER OF THE ADJACENT REAL ESTATE, AS PROVIDED BY LAW was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third reading. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Sutton, that the Ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None. The Ordinance was then numbered 580, and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly

signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

An Ordinance entitled, AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS, AND THE TRAFFIC THEREON, WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO: PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE PARKING OF
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VEHICLES UPON PUBLIC STREETS WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLMENT, REGULATION, CONTROL AND THE USE OF PARKING METERS; PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF PARKING METER ZONES UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, AND PRESCRIBING THE RIGHTS OF THE OWNERS OR OPERATORS OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN CONNECTION WITH THE PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN SAID ZONES; PRESCRIBING THE LIMITS OF TIME FOR PARKING MOTOR VEHICLES AND FOR THE DEPOSIT OF COINS WITHIN THE PARKING METERS; PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT AND FOR THE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF; was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Sutton; Nay: None. The Ordinance was then numbered 581 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved, and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

The Mayor stated that a Pomona Pump could be purchased from the Reed Hardware & Implement Company for the well at the Lower Power Plant for \$984.00 less allowance for the old pump and parts \$157.60. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the Purchasing Agent be authorized to purchase the pump. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried.

However, the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars as quoted is the cost of the entire equipment delivered at Idaho Falls future refilled large cylinders on the basis as stated.
