

NOVEMBER 16, 1945

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held November 16th, 1945.

There were present at said Meeting: Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Sutton, Crabtree, Wesley, Freeman. Absent: Mayor E. W. Fanning; when the following proceedings were had, to-wit: Minutes of the last regular Meeting were read and approved.

The following bids and applications to lease land on the Municipal Airport were opened and read:

- Plot No. 2. Whitehill and Sheehan 10,000 square feet @ .01 per square foot or \$100.00 per year.
- Plot No. 3. Wendell S. Warner 2500 square feet @ ½ cent per square foot per year. Drainage facilities to be corrected on the north ten feet of this plot.
- Plot No. 5. Ray Groth 6,000 square feet @ .01 per square foot per year.
- Plot No. 6. Idaho Potato Growers, Inc. 6,000 square feet @ ½ cent per square foot per year.
- Plot No. 7. F. L. Hansen 6,000 square feet @ ½ cent per square foot per year.
- Plot No. 8. Anton Poitevin, Jr. 6,000 square feet @ ½ cent per square foot per year.
- Plot No. 9. Anton Poitevin, 3rd 6,000 square feet @ ½ cent per square foot per year.

The following bids for lease of hangars, etc.

William Eugene Flint, Frederick A. Flint, and Rueben C. Smith. \$150.00 per month rent and collect rent on hangars to be constructed paying one half to the City.

Alfred J. Pouch bid \$250.00 per month rent on hangars, repair shops and care taker's house. Rental to be \$150.00 per month until the two new hangars are constructed, and \$250.00 per month when the new hangars are completed. In addition to the above rental will pay one-half of the caretakers salary, and also roll the snow on one runway whenever it is necessary.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the bids be taken under advisement until a recessed Meeting to be held November 20th, 1945. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The following Petition was read:

PETITION

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of Idaho Falls, Idaho:

We, the undersigned taxpayers, with property on Emerson Avenue West, hereby petition your Honorable Body to make Emerson Avenue a sixty (60) foot street from Lomax to May Street. It has an extra 14 feet or more in width and building cannot be done on uniform lines, and that would settle property lines and make it possible for uniform building lines.
