

OCTOBER 19, 1945

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held October 19th, 1945.

There were present at said Meeting: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

The following applications for Plumber licenses were read:

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Lease of Lots 23 and 24, in Block 12, of Mayflower Addition to Orland Eddins was read. It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Freeman, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the lease. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Plans and specifications for a deep well to be drilled on Central Park were presented to the City Council. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the City Clerk be authorized to advertise for bids for the drilling of a deep well on Central Park. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Application for widows allowance on water and light account signed by Mrs. Grace McAlister was read. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the regular allowance be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Charles Lee appeared before the City Council, and requested the City to close the alley back of his property on the North Highway. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the alley be closed for exclusive use of Charles Lee. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

W. F. Burtenshaw appeared before the City Council in regards to his permit to bury one 15,000 gallon gasoline tank on his property on the corner of Lava Street and the Yellowstone Highway. There seems to be some question as to the location of this tank. Is it now buried on his property or in the parking or space provided for the sidewalk? The Mayor referred the matter to the Street Committee and City Engineer with power to act.

Ralph Gesas appeared before the City Council, and requested permission be granted to construct two 18,000 gallon gasoline storage tanks on the Reliance Oil Company's property on the west side of the Snake River. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that permission be granted to construct the storage tanks but he must get a building permit from the Building Inspector. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Henry A. Beasley, owner of the Stockman's Bar at 310 Park Avenue, appeared before the City Council and was asked to show cause, if any, why his Beer license should not be revoked.

C. A. Carlson, Chief of Police, presented the Police Department records showing Police calls made at the Stockman's Bar.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the Beer license of Henry A. Beasley, owner of the Stockman's Bar, be revoked. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the Purchasing Agent be authorized to purchase 6,000 feet of four inch cast iron pipe. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Sutton, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Meeting adjourned.
