Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held September 21<sup>st</sup>, 1945.

There were present at said Meeting: Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Absent: Mayor E. W. Fanning; when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

The following applications for licenses were read:

City Cab Co. - 2 Taxicabs  
Anthony F. Hathaway - Electrical Contractor  
Norman L. Mathison - Journeyman Electrician  
Rainbow Bar B. Q. - Soft Drinks

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Freeman, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The following petition was read:

To The City Council  
Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned property owners, residing on the north side of Garfield Street and the south side of May Street, respectively, wish to call to the attention of the City Council that there is still no sewer in the alley between Garfield Street and May Street and that so long as this condition exists, it is impossible for ourselves and our families to enjoy the comfort and convenience of modern homes. For several years, some of us have consulted with various City Officials in an effort to secure the installation of a sewer in this alley, but we still do not have the sewer.

Now, with the end of the war, we believe the City of Idaho Falls can place this sewer at our disposal, in order that during the remodeling and building that will take place in this area within the next few months, we may have the advantage of connecting to a sewer and enjoying the convenience of modern homes just as people in other parts of town are doing.

We subsequently present this petition to which we have attached our signatures, and request that some serious consideration be given at the next Meeting of the Council. We believe that we are well within our rights, and that we are justly entitled to have this request granted, and to this end we hereby affix our signatures.

The Mayor referred the petition to the City Engineer.

Henry F. Martin and A. W. Brunt appeared before the City Council and requested permission to start to operate two busses under the franchise granted to the Idaho Falls Motor Coach Co., Inc. on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1941.

They stated that they would be able to start two busses by November 15<sup>th</sup>, 1945, and would give thirty-minute service to all parts of the City. The bus fare would be ten cents, and they would keep one extra bus in reserve so that service would not be interrupted by break-downs.

After considerable discussion the City Council advised Mr. Martin and Mr. Brunt that they would take the matter under advisement and would give them their decision at a Meeting of the City Council to be held September 25<sup>th</sup>, 1945.

Councilman Wasley read a report of the Electric Committee and City Electrician, and stated that a voltage regulator for the transmission lines could now be purchased from the General Electric Company. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the proposition of the City purchasing and operating a Public Scale be postponed indefinitely. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Crabtree, that the Meeting recess until Tuesday, September 25<sup>th</sup>, 1945 at 8 o'clock P.M. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Meeting was recessed.

Passed and approved this 5<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1945.
