Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held September 7<sup>th</sup>, 1945.

There were present at said Meeting: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crabtree, Wasley, Sutton; Absent: Freeman; when the following proceedings were had, to wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

The following monthly reports were read and approved: City Clerk, City Electrician, Waterworks Superintendent, Street & Park Commissioner, Sanitary & Meat Inspectors, Chief of Fire Department.

David Smith, President of LDS Temple, appeared before the City Council and requested the City to assist them in taking care of the large crowd of people who are expected to attend the opening of the Temple. Mr. Smith requested the City to take care of the sanitary conditions by installing thirty outside toilets. The Mayor stated that this would cost about \$600.00.

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the Mayor be authorized to construct and install the outside toilets near the Temple on Memorial Drive. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, and Wasley; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Motion carried.

The Finance Committee presented the following list of claims covering bills for the month of August, 1945, in the sum of \$40,929.10, which had been checked by the Purchasing Agent and approved by them, and they recommend that the same be allowed.

The following applications for Journeyman Plumber license were read: Charles H. Long and Vern Saxton. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Motion carried.

The following letter was read:

Honorable Mayor & Councilmen:

Gentlemen:

I hereby make applications for one small tract of land, triangle in shape, located west of Hart's Bakery and Hiway and just east of Dave Segal's residence, close by the place known as Ma's Place, for the purpose of continuing to operate an eating place for the convenience of the people in this neighborhood.

If you grant my request, I will erect or move a building on said ground for the above mentioned purpose.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Crabtree, that this small corner of land is not to be sold, but is to be held by the City for Street and Park purposes. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Sutton; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Motion carried.

Application for Bus Franchise signed by O. A. Toone was read. The Mayor referred the application to the Street Committee, and City Attorney.

The following Resolution was read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls is the owner of Lot Twenty-one (21) in Block One (1) of the Original Town Site of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, which property is not needed for public purposes,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That said property shall be sold for cash at public auction to the highest bidder, pursuant to the provisions of Section 49-138 Idaho Code Annotated, and that G. W. Wood, E. A. Wackerli, and A. H. Koster, three disinterested residents and freeholders of the City of Idaho Falls, be, and they are hereby appointed as appraisers to appraise said property.

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the Resolutions be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Motion carried.

Municipal Audit contract signed by Fred E. Ring was read. It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Sutton, that the contract be accepted. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Motion carried.

Application for widows allowance on water and light account signed by Mary Littleford was read. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the regular allowance be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Sutton; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Motion carried.

The Mayor recommends that the Berry & Ball building be inspected as a safety measure, and the two small frame buildings north of this building be inspected as they are considered a fire hazard.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Sutton, that the Building Inspector and Fire Chief inspect these three buildings, and make their report to the Mayor and City Council at the next Regular Meeting. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Motion carried.

The Mayor reported that two six plane steel hangars can now be purchased for about \$9,000.00, and the Mayor stated that these hangars should be ordered now in order to get them set up before winter. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the Mayor be authorized to order two six plane steel hangars for the Municipal Airport. Estimate cost to be about \$9,000.00. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Crabtree, Sutton; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Motion carried.

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Absent: Freeman; Meeting adjourned.

Passed and approved this 21<sup>st</sup> day of September, 1945.
