The following letter was read:

To the Honorable Mayor  
and City Council

Gentlemen:

On the west side of Cottage Avenue, there is a circuit, the poles on which are owned by the Postal Telegraph Co. and the City of Idaho Falls. This line of poles carried circuits belonging to both Companies. The Western Union, which has recently taken over the interest of the Postal Telegraph Co., now desires to abandon this circuit and offers to sell half interest in these poles to the City of Idaho Falls. The agreement covering this joint contract, specifies that if the party desires to abandon this interest, it shall sell this interest to the other at a price agreed upon. The Western Union Company offers to sell us its half interest in the thirty-four poles involved at \$2.00 per pole, or a total of \$68.00.

I took the agreements, which are attached hereto, to Mr. Albaugh, City Attorney, and it is his recommendation that we purchase the poles in question, obtaining a bill of sale from Western Union for this material.

It is my recommendation that this action be taken, as these poles cannot be replaced for the amount of money involved in this purchase.

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF COIN-OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICE OWNED AND OPERATED BY CLUBS AS DEFINED AND DESCRIBED IN HOUSE BILL NO. 164 OF THE 28<sup>th</sup> SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FIXING THE LICENSES FEE TO BE PAID TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, AND PROVIDING THE PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE," was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Crabtree; Nay: None; Absent: Sutton; Motion carried. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Absent: Sutton; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Absent: Sutton; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then numbered 573, and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved, and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.
