The following applications for licenses were read: Journeyman Plumber-Lewis Thompson; Soft Drinks-A. L. Cox.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the licenses be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The following Resolutions were read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 25, Article 49, Idaho Code Annotated, and by Deed of the City Treasurer of the City of Idaho Falls, dated the 27th day of January, 1942, recorded in Book 44 of Deeds at Page 620, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, and by Deed of the City Treasurer dated the 15th day of February, 1944, recorded in Book 49 of Deeds at Page 36, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title to, and possession of

Lot Forty (40) in Block Forty-seven (47) of Crow's Addition to the Original Town of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, according to the recorded plat thereof; and,

WHEREAS, RUTH BYBEE has offered to pay the City of Idaho Falls the amount, for which the property was sold to the City, together with all installments of assessments subsequent to the one for which said property was sold and then due, together with penalties and interest thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Lot Forty (40) in Block Forty-seven (47) of Crow's Addition to the Original Town of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, according to the recorded plat thereof; and,

WHEREAS, RUTH BYBEE has offered to pay the City of Idaho Falls the amount for which the property was sold to the City, together with all installments of assessments subsequent to the one for which said property was sold and then due, together with penalties and interest thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1945-1946, AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS," was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Freeman, that the Ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third reading. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Sutton, that the Ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then numbered 572 and passed to

the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved, and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

JUNE 6, 1945

Applications for widow's allowance on water and light accounts signed by Ora Ingram was read. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the application be rejected. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Agreement between the Snake River Mutual Fire Insurance Company and the City of Idaho Falls covering the use and operation of their fire truck by the City Fire Department was read. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the agreement. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The City Engineer presented to the City Council plans and specifications for the construction of a seal coat on approximately 135,000 square yards of asphaltic concrete paving in Original Town Railroad Addition, Holmes—subdivision of the City of Idaho Falls, together with a bituminous leveling course. The estimated cost to be about \$16,000.00. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Freeman, that the City Clerk be authorized to advertise for bids for the above work, and the bids are to be opened June 25th, 1945. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The Mayor recommends that the City purchase \$70,000.00 worth of U. S. Government C Bonds: \$20,000.00 worth out of the Waterworks Fund, and \$50,000.00 worth out of the Electric Light Fund. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Freeman, that the City Treasurer be authorized to purchase the above bonds. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Sutton, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; The Meeting was adjourned.

Passed and approved this 15th day of June, 1945.
