

DECEMBER 15, 1944

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held December 15<sup>th</sup>, 1944.

There were present at said Meeting: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; when the following proceedings were had to wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

The following applications for building permits were read:

No. 3302 signed by Lloyd Porter

No. 3303 signed by Mrs. Z. A. Lund

No. 3304 signed by Ray Benthin

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the permits be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

An Ordinance was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at the separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its third and final reading. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then numbered 571, and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved, and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

The following Resolution was read:

“RESOLVED that Mayor Fanning be, and he hereby is authorized to make arrangements with the County Commissioners of Bonneville County and the Probate Judge of Bonneville County to employ a juvenile officer to work under the supervision and out of the office of the Probate Judge: the City to pay one-half of the salary and expenses for such juvenile officer and Bonneville County, one-half thereof.

While the City Council understands that the Probate Court of Bonneville County had exclusive jurisdiction over juveniles and juvenile delinquency, the Council feels that the City and its citizens have a vital interest in the welfare of the children, and while the City understands that the Police Court has no authority or jurisdiction over such cases, nevertheless, it is proper and advisable for the City to assist in the employment of a juvenile officer and to pay part of his salary and expenses, and therefore, the Mayor is authorized to make arrangements accordingly.”

It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the Resolution be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Application for widow's allowance on water and light account signed by Mary A. Phelps was read. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the regular allowance be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Freeman, that the Mayor and City Electrician be authorized to purchase a new unit for the lower power plant. The water wheel to be purchased from the S. Morgan Smith Co. for \$48,475.00, and the generator from the General Electric Co. for \$35,362.00. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried.

Passed and approved this 5<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1945.
