The following letter was read:

Honorable Mayor and Members of City Council
Idaho Falls, Idaho

Gentlemen:

I have an option on 40 homes that can be moved into Idaho Falls to relieve the housing situation here in town and I also have the ground to move these houses onto providing the City water is available. So I'm asking that the City extend water-main 600 feet south along the County Road from the hydrant that is now located just west of the Idaho Potato Growers Association so that we could make service connections to each of the houses that would be moved in.

I trust that you gentlemen are aware of the critical housing situation here in Idaho Falls and by moving these homes it would help this situation out considerably.

My option on the purchase of these homes will expire Saturday, October 7th, and I must have an answer as to whether you will immediately extend the water-main as requested or not. I will lose my deposit and will be unable to move these homes unless you will agree to extend the water-main.

Beginning at the southeast corner of Lot 11, Block 9, Dwight's Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and running thence west, Twenty-four (24) feet, to the easterly line of the U. S. Highway No. 91 (Yellowstone Highway); thence north 36°25' east, along said easterly line of U. S. Highway No. 91, Forty and Four Tenths (40.4) feet; thence south, Thirty-

Two and Five Tenths (32.5) feet; to the point of beginning and containing 390 square feet.
