

MAY 19, 1944

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held May 19th, 1944.

There were present at said Meeting: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; when the following proceedings were had, to wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

Budget Estimate for the Fiscal Year 1944-1945 was presented and read to the City Council as follows:

BUDGET ESTIMATE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1944-1945

The following is an estimate of the amount of money necessary for all purposes to be raised by taxation or otherwise in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, during the Fiscal Year 1944-1945, for which, an appropriation is to be made as provided by law; said money to be apportioned for the purpose of paying indebtedness now existing and to accrue against the various funds of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, as follows: to-wit:

Application for water extension signed by Frank S. Newell was read. The Mayor referred the application to the Water and Light Committee, Waterworks Superintendent, and City Engineer.

It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Wasley, that the City purchase one and one-fourth (1¼) acres of land from Virginia Blackburn for \$250.00 to widen Holmes Avenue in front of her property. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried.

It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Sutton, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried.
