TO: THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
IDAHO FALLS, AND TO THE UNION PACIFIC

JULY 7, 1943

We, the undersigned, residents of Idaho Falls, Idaho, residing in the vicinity of Union Pacific Roundhouse, hereby request that the smoke stacks on said Roundhouse be substantially increased in height, as the top of this smoke stack is now two feet below the center of the roof of the Roundhouse, and in so low that the smoke coming from the stacks is a nuisance to all of the people residing in that vicinity.

We understand that Union Pacific Rules and Regulations No. 2495 requires the top of all smoke stacks to be at least 15 feet above the highest part of the building; whereas, the top of these smoke stacks is about two feet below the top of the building.

Idaho Falls  
June 30, 1943

Honorable Mayor and City Councilmen:

In as much as we have bought 28 Lots in the Highland District, part of it in alfalfa, corn, carrots, and Victory Garden. We would like to fence it, for people living beyond it have used it for a short cut to work and to town, until now there are paths thru the hay.

Owing to conditions it is almost impossible to get fencing of any kind except we have some barb wire.

We understand that it is against the City Ordinance to us barb wire. We were wondering if under the circumstances you might give us permission to use this we may have with the understanding that just as soon as the other is obtainable we will change it.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the Mayor be authorized to make arrangements with the Navy to rent the ground floor of the Armory for Navy V-12 Cadets. Rental to

be \$150.00 per month. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; motion carried.

It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the Meeting recess until Friday July 9<sup>th</sup>, 1943 at 8 o'clock P.M. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; motion carried.
