Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho held April 16th, 1943.

There were present at said Meeting: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; when the following proceedings were had to wit:

It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the permits be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: none; motion carried.

Lease covering land for Park Site for five years with the Union Pacific Railroad Company was read. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the lease. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay; none; motion carried.

The following Resolutions were read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 25, Article 49 Idaho Code Annotated, and by deed of the City Treasurer of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, dated the 1st day of February, 1943, recorded in Book 45 of Deeds at Page 337, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title to, and possession of all of Lot 19 and the West Half of Lot 18 to, in Block 60 of Crow's Addition to the Original Town of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, according to the recorded plat thereof; and,

WHEREAS, C. A. SUNDBERG has offered to pay to the City of Idaho Falls the amount for which the property was sold to the City, together with all installments of assessments APRIL 16, 1943

subsequent to the one for which said property was sold and then due, together with penalties and interest thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Mayor and City Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, upon the payment of said sum by said purchaser, to make, execute and deliver to the said C. A. Sundberg, for, and in the name of the City of Idaho Falls, a deed to said property pursuant to the provisions of Section 49-2551 Idaho Code Annotated.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 25, Article 49, Idaho Code Annotated, and by deed of the City Treasurer of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, dated the 1st day of February, 1943, recorded in Book 45 of Deeds at Page 332, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title to, and possession of all of Lot 19 and the West half of Lot 18 in Block 60, Crow's Addition to the Original Town of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, according to the recorded plat thereof; and,

WHEREAS, C. A. SUNDBERG has offered to pay to the City of Idaho Falls, the amount for which the property was sold to the City, together with all installments of assessments subsequent to the one for which said property was sold and then due, together with penalties and interest thereon;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Mayor and City Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, upon the payment of said sum by said purchaser, to make, execute and deliver to the said C. A. SUNDBERG, for, and in the name of the City of Idaho Falls, a deed to said property pursuant to the provisions of Section 49-2551 Idaho Code Annotated.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Crabtree, that the Resolutions be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: none; motion carried.

An Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE WORD "FUMIGATION"; FUMIGATORS; REQUIRING A PERMIT FOR FUMIGATION; CREATING A BOARD OF FUMIGATION AND VESTING SAID BOARD WITH THE POWER TO PRESCRIBE RULES AND REGULATIONS COVERING FUMIGATION IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THE TERMS OF THIS ORDINANCE AND OF THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF SAID FUMIGATION BOARD"; was read in full by

the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: none; motion carried.

APRIL 16, 1943

Floyd Mead requests permission to remove fifty feet of curb in front of his store at 214 1st Street to widen the street for more parking space for cars and trucks. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that permission be granted to Floyd Mead to remove the curb, and the Street Committee contact the 1st Street Grocery and get them to make the same improvement. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: none; motion carried.

Application for widows allowance on water and light account signed by Edith Green was read. It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Sutton, that the regular allowance be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: none; motion carried.

The Mayor recommends that the City purchase a used International Truck from R. O. Braithwaite for the Garbage Department for \$1200.00. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Wasley, that the Purchasing Agent be authorized to purchase the truck. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: none; motion carried.

The Mayor stated that Paul Crowder wanted permission to go to Ogden to study some branch of the army before he is called to report next month, and this would leave the Police Radio without an operator with a second class license.

K.I.D. Radio Station has agreed to have their operator service the Police Radio set for \$90.00 per month. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Freeman, that the K.I.D. licensed operator be employed by the City to service the Police Radio set for \$90.00 per month. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: none; motion carried.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Freeman, that the Meeting adjourn. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: none; motion carried.
