

OCTOBER 16, 1942

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held October 16th, 1942.

There were present at said Meeting: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman. Then the following proceedings were had to wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

The following applications for building permits were read:

No. 2984 Signed by Upper S. R. D. Assn.

No. 2985 Signed by Idaho Potato Grower's Assn.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the permits be approved. Roll call voting Aye: Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; motion carried.

The following Resolutions were read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 25, Article 49 Idaho Code Annotated, and by deed of the City Treasurer of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, dated the 27th day of January, 1942, recorded in Book 44 of Deeds at Page 606, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title to, and possession of all of Lots 29 to 32, both inclusive, in Block 1 of Crow's Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Bonneville County, Idaho, according to the recorded plat thereof; and

WHEREAS, EDWARD HUGH CAMERON has offered to pay to the City of Idaho Falls the amount for which the property was sold to the City, together with all installments of assessments subsequent to the one for which said property was sold and then due, together with penalties and interest thereon;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Mayor and City Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized and directed upon the payment of said sum by said purchaser, to make, execute and deliver to the said EDWARD HUGH CAMERON for, and in the name of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, a deed to said property pursuant to the provisions of Section 49-2551 Idaho Code Annotated.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 25, Article 49, Idaho Code Annotated and by deed of the City Treasurer of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, dated the 27th day of January, 1942, recorded in Book 44 of Deeds at Page 582, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title to, and possession of all of Lots 29 to 32, both inclusive in Block 1 of Crow's Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, according to the recorded plat thereof; and,

WHEREAS, EDWARD HUGH CAMERON has offered to pay to the City of Idaho Falls the amount for which the property was sold to the City, together with all installments of assessments subsequent to the one for which said property was sold and then due, together with penalties and interest thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Mayor and City Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, upon the payment of said sum by said purchaser, to make, execute and deliver to the said EDWARD HUGH CAMERON, for, and in the name of the City of Idaho Falls, a deed to said property pursuant to the provisions of Section 49-2551 Idaho Code Annotated.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Freeman, that the Resolutions be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; motion carried.

Application for widows allowance on water and light account, signed by Nettie Johnson, was read. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the regular allowance be granted. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; motion carried.

Dear Folks of the City,

OCTOBER 16, 1942

I wish to tell you at our last meeting of the American War mothers, we voted on a Resolution asking the City to preserve the old house so recently purchased from Mrs. Sabra Roberts. It surely is an old place and occupied so many years by one of our war mothers. Since we have had to give up our beautiful room in the Armory, it would not be too much to ask of you that we have a room in this old house. This is only an idea to pass on to you for we realize it should take a lot of work to make a nice "home" for us. Anyway, can it not be kept as a sort of historic land mark for our new and improved Idaho Falls.

Thanking you for all you have done for us in the past, we beg to remain sincerely your friends.
