

JUNE 7, 1941

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held June 7th, 1941.

There were present at said Meeting: Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, and Wasley; Absent: Mayor E. W. Fanning.

An Ordinance entitled: "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1941-1942, AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate Meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Freeman, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was then numbered 548 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

MUNICIPAL AUDIT CONTRACT

To the Council and/or Board of Trustees
of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho:

I propose to audit the books of Idaho Falls for the period from May 1, 1941, to April 30, 1943 on the following terms:

The audit of the City of Idaho Falls shall be performed in accordance with the Uniform Specifications for Audit of all incorporated cities and villages, as adopted by the Bureau of Public Accounts as of November 1, 1935, and subsequent amendments, and audit shall be compiled within 90 days after close of Fiscal Year period. My fees subject to the existing statutes of Idaho pertaining to incorporated City and/or village audits will be payable upon approval by the Council or Board of Trustees of the reports, at the rate of \$187.50 for the first three quarters of each Fiscal Year and \$287.50 for the fourth quarter of each Fiscal Year.
