

MAY 16, 1941

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held May 16th, 1941.

There were present at said Meeting: E. W. Fanning, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton. When the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of the last Regular Meeting were read and approved.

Budget estimate for the Fiscal Year 1941-1942 was presented and read to the City Council as follows:

An Ordinance entitled: “AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL, AND PRESCRIBING HIS TERM OF OFFICE, PRIVILEGES AND DUTIES AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH” was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the Ordinance be passed

on its first reading. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman, Sutton; Nay: None; Motion carried. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the rule of law requiring that an Ordinance be read at three separate meetings be suspended, and the Ordinance be placed on its second and third reading. Roll call voting Aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the Ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call voting Aye; Wasley, Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree; Nay: None; Motion carried. The Ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the Ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call voting Aye: Freeman, Sutton, Crabtree, Wasley; Nay: None; Motion carried.

The Ordinance was then numbered 547 and passed to the Mayor for his approval and was, by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Freeman, that Thomas L. Sutton be elected President of the City Council. Roll call voting Aye: Crabtree, Wasley, Freeman; Sutton, Pass; Motion carried.
