

AUGUST 9, 1940

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Evans, that the permits be approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Fanning, Gourley, Wasley, Evans, Crabtree, Brandl. Absent: Mehlhoff and Sutton. Motion carried.

At this time councilman Mehlhoff entered the meeting and took part in the proceedings.

Building permit No. 2435 signed by Frank Hicks was read. The Mayor referred the permit to the Building Committee for investigation as to why there were no plumbing fixtures to be installed in this house.

The following resolution was read:

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RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works of the State of Idaho has submitted plans for the improvement of the Yellowstone Park Highway within the corporate limits of the City of Idaho Falls, said improvement to consist of widening, draining and hard surfacing on 0.759 miles within the corporate limits and to be constructed as Federal Aid Project No. 14 A(2)B(3); and,

WHEREAS, the allotment of Federal and State funds for the improvement is contingent on compliance with the laws governing state highways and state highway traffic, availability of necessary right of way and adequate provision for the maintenance of the completed improvement:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved;

1. That the location, alignment, grades and cross section of the proposed state highway improvement as shown by the plans are hereby accepted and approved.

2. That all right of way required for the improvement within the corporate limits shall be acquired and furnished by and at the sole expense of the city.

3. That the city does hereby agree to maintain the completed improvement to the standard to which said improvement is constructed at its sole expense.

4. That the city does hereby agree to improve and maintain at its own expense any portions of its street or streets on the route of said highway, not included in the proposed improvement, in such manner as to permit the safe and convenient use of the improvement by the traveling public.

5. That any drainage or irrigation gutters or structures not included in the proposed improvement and required for its proper maintenance and protection shall be provided by and at the expense of the city.

6. That the Department of Public Works is hereby requested and authorized to erect and maintain standard route markers, stop signs, direction signs and warning signs where required on the state highway route within the municipal limits, subject however, to any municipal regulations governing the location and placing of such markers and signs.

7. That suitable measures shall be taken by the city to prevent the erection or maintenance of any advertising sign, vending establishment or other structure or object encroaching on the highway right of way or the platted width of any street constituting a part of the state highway route; or the erection or maintenance on or along or visible from the state highway within the municipal limits of any warning or direction sign, marker, signal, or light in imitation as regards either wording or appearance of any official sign, marker, signal or light erected under the provisions of Chapter 5, Title 48, Idaho Code Annotated and preventing any person other than authorized employees or agents of the Commissioner of Public Works to erect or maintain or cause to be erected or maintained upon or

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along or visible from any state highway within the municipal limits any sign intended for the advise or direction of traffic or purporting to give the distances between towns on the state highway or conditions of travel on the alternate routes or any sign or marker intended to designate such highway by other than its official designation.

8. That no speed restrictions other than those provided by the State Statutes shall be imposed on any portion of the route of the proposed improvement except with the concurrence of the Department of Public Works.

9. That certified copies of this resolution shall be furnished the Department of Public Works and the United States Bureau of Public Roads."

It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Wasley, that the resolution be adopted and approved, and the Mayor be authorized to sign the maintenance agreement. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.

The Mayor appointed Forest G. Perrin as patrolman on the Police Department. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Gourley, that the appointment be confirmed. Roll call. Voting aye: Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Brandl, that the Mayor be authorized to write the L. D. S. Church, and advise them that the City will help them to clear up the balance of the property for the Temple just as soon as funds for same are available. Roll call. Voting aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Evans, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call. Voting aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Crabtree, Brandl. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.
