The Mayor referred the petition to the Light & Water Committee.

The following Notice was read:

"February 9th, 1940.

TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO.

DEAR Sirs:

I am writing you this notice as Attorney for Mr. C. T. Edwards, who has a farm of approximately fifteen acres, lying south of Idaho Falls.

He has just notified me that his attention has been called to the fact that some action has been taken by the City to include his farm within the City limits of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

He says he has had no notice and did not know that his land was included in any description of any proposed addition to the City.

His tract of land in on the west side of the Highway in Lot 1 of Section 25, Township 2 North, Range 37 East, Boise Meridian, and commencing on the north side of the highway, approximately 1150 feet south of the intersection of the said highway with the north line of said section, and is a tract approximately 850 feet by 900 feet, extending from the highway to the river.

The county's computation of acreage in its assessment roll, brands it 14.76 acres, after deducting various tracts which he has heretofore sold to other parties.

Mr. Edwards wants to register his objections to any attempt of the City to include the said land within the said City limits, and, of course, will, if necessary, defend his rights under the laws of the State of Idaho, in such cases made and provided.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGISTRATION OF BICYCLES: PROVIDING FOR THE DISPLAYING OF NUMBER PLATES THEREON: MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO RIDE A BICYCLE ON THE SIDEWALKS OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS: AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Brandl, seconded by Evans, that the ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the rule of law requiring than an ordinance be read at three separate meetings be suspended, and the ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Wasley, that the ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Gourley, that the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered 531 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

Purchase agreement covering two 1875 K.V.A. Transformers purchased from Westinghouse Electric & Manufacturing Company for \$10,376.00 with a down payment of \$1376.00 was read. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Brandl, that the order be approved and the Mayor be authorized to sign the purchase agreement, and a warrant be issued for \$1376.00 to cover the down payment. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

An ordinance entitled: "AN ORDINANCE GRANTING WILLIAM J. VAIL AN EXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE TO USE THE STREETS AND AVENUES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPERATING PASSENGER BUSES: REQUIRING THE FILING OF ROUTE SCHEDULES WITH THE CITY CLERK: PROVIDING THE MAXIMUM FARE TO BE CHARGED: PROVIDING FOR THE CLASS OF SERVICE TO BE GIVEN: PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE: PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION OF SUITABLE PARKING PLACES: PROVIDING PAYMENT OF A PERCENTAGE OF THE GROSS INCOME TO THE CITY: AND FOR GENERAL REGULATIONS OF SAID BUSES BY THE CITY COUNCIL" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Fanning, that the ordinance be passed on its first
