Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned members of the Eastern Idaho Master Plumbers Association in session in Idaho Falls, Idaho, on the above named date do hereby respectfully call to the attention of your Honorable Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, the failure of the proper officers of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, to appoint an examining board to examine applicants for licenses for Master and Journeymen Plumbers as is in Ordinance #471 of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, provided.

We, the undersigned members, as aforesaid, call to your attention the failure of the examining board of Master and Journeymen Plumbers to function as is provided by law.

We, the undersigned members, as aforesaid, call to your attention the failure to inspect plumbing in the City of Idaho Falls as is by ordinance provided.

We, the undersigned members, as aforesaid, recommend that Section 107 of the Revised Ordinances as revised March 17, 1922, be amended by striking out the words “plumbing” and “Sewer Inspector”.

We, the undersigned, recommend that Chapter XXXII be amended by adding a new section known as Section 797 which section shall provide for the appointment by the Mayor of a full time practical plumbing inspector who shall have all the powers necessary to the full performance of his

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duties. Said amendment to be made immediately and the mayor to appoint said inspector immediately so that the plumbing ordinances of Idaho Falls, Idaho, can be enforced.

We, the undersigned, petition your Honorable Mayor and Council to take immediate action upon the foregoing recommendations.

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The following Resolution was read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, did, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 25, Article 49 Idaho Code Annotated, and by deed of the City Treasurer of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, dated December 21, 1939, recorded in Book 39 of Deeds at Page 598, records of Bonneville County, Idaho, acquire title and possession of lots 6 and 7, Block 59 of Crow's Addition to the Original Town of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho; and,

WHEREAS, John M. Homer has offered to pay to the City of Idaho Falls, the amount for which the property was sold to the city, together with all installments of assessments subsequent to the one for which said property was sold and then dur, together with penalties and interest thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Mayor and City Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, upon the payment of said sum by said purchaser, to make, execute and deliver to the said John M. Homer, for, and in the name of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, a deed to said property pursuant to the provisions of Section 49-2551 Idaho Code Annotated."

An ordinance entitled: "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 498 OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, PROVIDING THAT THE CITY CLERK SHALL KEEP AN ACCOUNT OF ALL ELECTRIC METER DEPOSITS AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH METER DEPOSITS SHALL BE CREDITED TO, AND DEPOSITED IN THE GENERAL FUND OF THE CITY, EXCEPTING ONLY A SPECIFIED AMOUNT OR SUM TO BE KEPT BY THE CLERK IN A SPECIAL FUND OR ACCOUNT" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Crabtree, that the ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Evans, that the rule of law requiring that an ordinance be read at three separate meetings be suspended, and the ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call. Voting aye: Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Brandl, that the ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

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The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Evans, that the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered 537 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was, by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

An ordinance entitled: "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF AN OWNER OR PERSON IN CHARGE OF ANY BUILDING IN THE BUSINESS DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, SITUATE WITH FIFTY FEET OF A STORM SEWER, TO CONNECT THE ROOF DRAINAGE WITH SAID STORM SEWER: PROVIDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH SAID WORK MUST BE COMMENCED AND COMPLETED: PROVIDING THAT ANY OWNER OR PERSON IN CHARGE OF SAID BUILDING WHO FAILS TO CONNECT THE ROOF DRAINAGE THEREOF AS HEREIN PROVIDED SHALL BE GUILTY OF MAINTAINING A PUBLIC NUISANCE: PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE: PROVIDING THAT EACH DAY SUCH NUISANCE IS MAINTAINED SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENCE: AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Brandl, that the rule of law requiring that an ordinance be read at three separate meetins be suspended, and the ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Gourley, that the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered 538 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

The following resolution was read:

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, TO GRADE, GRAVEL, PRIME COAT AND PAVE A PORTION OF "C"

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STREET IN SAID CITY: TO CREATE LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 19 FOR IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING SAID IMPROVEMENTS: TO DEFRAY THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF SAID DISTRICT AND ALL OF COSTS AND EXPENSES OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS BY SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS LEVIED UPON AND AGAINST THE LOTS AND LANDS ABUTTING, ADJOINING AND ADJACENT TO THE STREET TO BE SO IMPROVED, AND ON AND AGAINST ALL LOTS AND LANDS BENEFITED BY SUCH IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDED IN SAID DISTRICT AND DECLARING SAID IMPROVEMENTS TO BE AN ORIGINAL IMPROVEMENT OR IMPROVEMENTS: GIVING THE KIND AND CHARACTER OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF: FIXING THE TIME WHEN PROTESTS AGAINST SAID IMPROVEMENTS AND THE CREATION OF SAID DISTRICT MAY BE FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK AND WHEN SUCH PROTESTS WILL BE HEARD AND CONSIDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL: AND PROVIDING FOR GIVING NOTICE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City Council of Idaho Falls, Idaho, deems it for the best interests of the City to grade, gravel, prime coat and pave a portion of "C" street within the corporate limits of said City hereinafter particularly described; and to create Local Improvement District No. 19 for the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho; for the purpose of making said improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council proposes to defray the cost and expense of said district and of said improvements by special assessments levied upon and against the lots and lands abutting, adjoining and adjacent to the street to be so improved, and on and against all land benefited by said improvement included in said District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, AS FOLLOWS:

Sec. 1. The City of Idaho Falls does hereby declare its intention to grade, gravel, prime coat and pave that portion of "C" Street, now unpaved, from the West Side of Cottage Avenue to the East Side of Park Avenue, and for that purpose to create and establish a local improvement district therein to be known as Local Improvement District No. 19 of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, comprising said "C" Street from the West Side of Cottage Avenue to the East Side of Park Avenue and the lots and lands abutting, adjoining and adjacent thereto, and the lots and lands benefited by such improvements and situate in said District, which said lots and lands are described as follows: to wit:

Lots Seven (7) to Eighteen (18), both inclusive in Block Fifteen (15) of Holmes Subdivision of Railroad Addition to the City of Idaho Falls;

Lots Seven (7) to Eighteen (18), both inclusive, in Block Sixteen (16) of Holmes Subdivision of Railroad Addition to the City of Idaho Falls;

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Lots Seven (7) to Eighteen (18), both inclusive, in Block Seventeen (17) of Holmes Subdivision of Railroad Addition to the City of Idaho Falls; and

Lots Seven (7) to Eighteen (18), both inclusive, in Block Eighteen (18) of Holmes Subdivision of Railroad Addition to the City of Idaho Falls.

Sec. 2. The kind and character of said improvements are grading, gravelling, prime coating, and paving with a suitable non-skid asphalt pavement, on the unpaved part of said portion of said "C" Street, all according to plans and specifications to be filed in the office of the City Engineer and City Clerk on or before the day fixed for hearing protests against the creation of said District and the making of said improvements.

Sec. 3. The said improvements are original.

Sec. 4. The estimated total cost and expenses of said District and of said improvements are \$3,994.21, which sum shall be paid by special assessments.

Sec. 5. The total costs and expenses of said District and of said improvements are to be assessed against the abutting, and adjoining and adjacent lots and lands on that part of "C" Street on which said improvements are to be made and upon lots and lands benefit by such improvements and included within said District; each lot and parcel of land being assessed separately for the debt thereof in proportion to the number of square feet of said lots and lands abutting, adjoining or adjacent thereto, or included in said district to the distance back from said streets and parts of streets, if platted in blocks to the center of the blocks, if platted in lots to the center of the lots and if not platted, to the distance of 120 feet, and in proportion to the benefits derived to such lots and lands by said improvements, sufficient to cover the total cost and expense of said improvements to the center of the street.

Sec. 6. That Friday, The 24th day of May, 1940, at 7:30 o'clock P.M. of said day, and the chambers of the City Council in the City Hall in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, be, and the same hereby are designated as the time and place when protests against the creation of said District and the making of said improvements will be heard and considered by the City Council and that protests against said improvements or the creation of such district may be filed in the office of the City Clerk on or before the day of such meeting, to, but not later than the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. of said day. And said Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to give notice of the passage of this Resolution, the time within which protests against such proposed improvements or the creation of said District may be filed and the date when such protests will be heard and considered by the Council in the manner provided by law.

Passed by the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, this 8th day of May, 1940.

Ekstrand is to move his house off the land at his own expense. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.
