Petition for the Creation of Paving District.

Honorable Mayor and City Council,
Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned property owners and taxpayers owning the property described following our names hereinafter subscribed, hereby petition you honorable body to create a special paving improvement district on C Street, between Blocks 15 and 18 and 16 and 17 of Holmes Sub-Division of Railroad Addition to Idaho Falls, which district will extend from Cottage Avenue on the East to Park Avenue on the west, this paving to cover the center of the street now occupied by the street parks.

The following resolution was read:

APRIL 5, 1940

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, is the owner of the following described real property, to wit:

Beginning at a point on the north line of Lot 1, Block 60, Original Town of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, that is southeasterly 9.74 feet from the northwest corner of said Lot 1 and running thence southeasterly 77.76 feet, along said north property line of Lots 1 and 2 of said Block 60, thence southwesterly 102.48 feet, along a line parallel to and 12.5 feet westerly from the east line of said Lot 2, thence northerly 145.1 feet in a straight line to the point of beginning, all being in Lots 1 and 2 of Block 60 of the Original Town of Eagle Rock, now the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and,

WHEREAS, said property is not required, used or needed as a public park, playground or public building site and is not needed for municipal purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That said property be offered for sale at private sale and that the Clerk publish notice of intention to sell said property as provided by law.

It was moved by Evans, seconded by Sutton, that the resolution be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

An ordinance entitled: "AN ORDINANCE GRANTING WILLIAM J. VAIL AN EXCLUSIVE FRANCISE TO USE THE STREETS AND AVENUES OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPERATING PASSENGER BUSSES: REQUIRING THE FILING OF ROUTE SCHEDULES WITH THE CITY CLERK: PROVIDING THE MAXIMUM FARE TO BE CHARGED: PROVIDING FOR THE CLASS OF SERVICE TO BE GIVEN: PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE: PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION OF SUITABLE PARKING PLACES: PROVIDING PAYMENT OF A PERCENTAGE OF THE GROSS INCOME TO THE CITY: AND FOR GENERAL REGULATIONS OF SAID BUSSES BY THE CITY COUNCIL", was read in full by the Clerk.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Gourley, that the ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

APRIL 5, 1940

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Sutton, that the rule of law requiring that an ordinance be read at three separate meetings be suspended, and the ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Brandl, that the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered 536 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved, and ordered published in one issue of the Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls, when Section 9 of said ordinance is complied with.

The following petition was read:

The said lots are in a deplorable condition, and threatens the health and well being of the people in that vicinity.
