

DECEMBER 8, 1939

Minutes of a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held December 1st, 1939 and recessed until December 8th, 1939.

There were present at said meeting Chase A. Clark, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Absent: None. When the following proceedings were had, to wit:

The following monthly reports were read and approved: City Clerk, City Electrician, Water Works Superintendent, Street & Park Commissioner, Sanitary & Meat Inspector, Chief of Fire Department, City & School Nurse.

The following resolution was read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Lots 11 and 12 in Block 19 of Holmes Subdivision to Railroad Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, are vacant lots and adjoin the Federal Building of the west side thereof; and,

WHEREAS, with the steady and rapid growth of the City of Idaho Falls, said lots will be needed in the near future for an addition to the U.S. Post Office and Federal Building and should now be used by post office employees and occupants of the Federal Building for parking their automobiles instead of causing congestion in parking spaces on the streets near said Federal Building; and,

WHEREAS, there is no parking lot for automobiles near said Federal Building; and,

WHEREAS, said vacant lots will probably be improved and a building constructed thereon in the not far distant future and said lots will not be available for the use of the Post Office Department and other Departments of the United States Government without large additional cost and expense; and,

WHEREAS, said vacant lots are the only vacant lots adjacent to, or near said Federal Building;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls do hereby urge and recommend that the United States purchase said vacant lots for the future use of the United States.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution should be transmitted by the City Clerk to our Senators and Representatives in Congress and to the proper officers of the Post Office Department."

It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Brandl, that the resolution be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The following petition was read:

Dec. 8-1939

To The Honorable Mayor and City Council
Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Gentlemen:

We the undersigned tax payers and property owners, owning the hereinafter described property facing on C Street in Idaho Falls, Idaho, hereby request that the city proceed to remove the parking from the center of street at once.

This parking was placed in the center of the street some thirty years ago when there was no business establishments on this street and it was an asset to the city and beautification of the street at that time, but conditions have materially changed on the street since then until now some of the largest businesses of the city are located on this street and this parking is a great handicap to the business located on the street and a consequent damage to the property, so at the present time business is being driven away from the street as a result of this parking.

If this parking is removed during the winter months, the fine hardwood trees and shrubbery can be removed to other parts of the city without it being necessary to destroy them.

We earnestly urge this matter be acted on at once and the work completed before spring.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Sutton, that the City exercise the option for the generator for the lower power plant, and the Purchasing Agent be authorized to advise the General Electric Company to start to build the generator. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.
