Minutes of a special meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held October 19th, 1939, pursuant to the following call:

Please take notice that I have called a meeting of the City Council of said City to be held in the Council Chamber of the City Building on the 19 day of October, 1939, at 8 o'clock P.M., for the purpose of passing Ordinance No. 528 and No. 529, and considering an entry of a Base Ball Club by the City in the Pioneer League.

There were present at said meeting Chase A. Clark, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans. Absent: None. When the following proceedings were had, to wit:

Minutes of last regular meeting were read and approved.

Councilman Evans made a report on the Chamber of Commerce committee meetings in regard to Idaho Falls entering into the Pioneer Base Ball League and after consideration, it was moved by Evans, seconded by Fanning, that the City accept the recommendation of the Chamber of Commerce Committee, and enter into an agreement with F. W. Collins of Lewiston, Idaho, and the New York Yankee Baseball Club to sponsor a base ball team in the Pioneer League. The sponsors are to furnish and finance the ball club, and the City will furnish the ball park with lights for night games, and are to receive the 10% admission tax on all tickets. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

OCTOBER 19, 1939

Application for rooming house license for the Hanson Hotel was read. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Brandl, that the license be granted. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The following resolution was read:

**A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE
IMPROVEMENTS OF "SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 18"
P. W. A. PROJECT NO. 1158-F IN IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO.**

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho did enter into an agreement with the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA through the FEDERAL EMERGENCY ADMINISTRATION OF PUBLIC WORKS for constructing the improvements of Special Improvement District No. 18 of Idaho Falls, Idaho, known as P. W. A. Project No. 1158-F.

AND, WHEREAS; the contract was awarded to W. C. Burns, Max J. Kuney, and Olof Nelson Construction Co. to perform such work,

AND, WHEREAS, the said construction work has been completed and the final estimate made in the amount of \$128,247.14,

AND, WHEREAS, the work has been completed and installed, and conforms to the plans and specifications under which the contract was awarded,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the said Project No. 1158-F, Special Improvement District No. 18 of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, be and is hereby accepted by the City this nineteenth day of October, 1939."

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Fanning, that the resolution be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl. Voting nay: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

Cal Rines appeared before the Council to answer the Notice and Order served on him on August 16th, 1939, in regard to his beer license. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Brandl, that the beer license of Cal Rines be revoked. Roll call. Voting aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

An ordinance entitled: AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF MEAT INSPECTOR AND PROVIDING FOR HIS QUALIFICATIONS AND APPOINTMENT AND FIXING HIS DUTIES AND AUTHORITY, AND REQUIRING THE FLESH OF ALL CATTLE, SHEEP, SWINE, CALVES AND OTHER DOMESTIC ANIMALS TO BE INSPECTED AND STAMPED BEFORE SAME ARE OFFERED FOR SALE IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO: PROVIDING THAT ALL PERSONS SLAUGHTERING OR SELLING FRESH MEATS OR MEAT PRODUCTS IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, SHALL FIRST OBTAIN PERMIT THEREFORE AND THE MANNER OF

OBTAINING THE SAME, AND FEE THEREFORE: AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTION OF PREMISES WHERE FRESH MEAT IS SOLD OR KEPT FOR SALE: MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO BRING OR CAUSE TO BE BROUGHT IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS MEAT OF ANY SUCH ANIMALS WITHOUT THE INSPECTION STAMP OF THE IDAHO FALLS MEAT INSPECTOR OR THE STAMP OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AFFIXED THEREON: PROVIDING FOR THE SELECTION OF A PLACE OF INSPECTION: PROVIDING THAT THE HEAD AND THAT CERTAIN VITAL ORGANS SHALL BE INTACT IN THE ANIMAL WHEN SO INSPECTED: PROVIDING THAT REGULATION FOR INSPECTION SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES ESTABLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE: PROVIDING A SCHEDULE OF FEES TO BE CHARGED FOR INSPECTION OF ANIMALS AND COLLECTION THEREOF: MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO COUNTERFEIT, USE OF INTERFERE WITH THE STAMP OF THE IDAHO FALLS MEAT INSPECTOR: PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH", was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the ordinance be passed on it third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered 528 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

An ordinance entitled: AN ORDINANCE VACATING AND CLOSING A CERTAIN PORTION OF G STREET, A CERTAIN PORTION OF MOUND AVENUE, A CERTAIN PORTION OF THE ALLEY BETWEEN SAGE AVENUE AND MOUND AVENUE, A CERTAIN PORTION OF THE ALLEY BETWEEN MOUND AVENUE AND WILLOW AVENUE, A CERTAIN PORTION OF THE ALLEY BETWEEN H AND I STREET, A CERTAIN PORTION OF H STREET, AND A PORTION OF WILLOW AVENUE IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, FOR THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE USE OF THE CORPORATION OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY SAINTS, AND CORPORATION SOLE.", was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Evans, that the ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mehlhoff, seconded by Brandl, that the rule of law requiring that an ordinance be read at three separate meetings be suspended, and the ordinance be placed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Wasley, that the ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Crabtree, that the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered 529 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was, by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved, and ordered published in one issue of the Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Fanning, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.
