RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE AMENDATORY OFFER OF THE UNITED STATES TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, TO AID BY WAY OF GRANT IN FINANCING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A LIBRARY ADDITION, INCLUDING NECESSARY EQUIPMENT.

Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho:

Section 1. That the amendatory offer of the United States of America to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, to aid by way of grant in financing the construction of a Library Addition, including necessary equipment, a copy of which Amendatory Offer reads as follows, be and the same is hereby in all respects accepted:

The United States of America hereby offers to amend the contract created by the acceptance by the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, on November 18, 1938, of the Offer made by the United States of America

and dated November 7, 1938, by (1) striking out, in Line 8 of Paragraph 1 of said Offer, the figures "\$18,000" and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "\$31,500", and (2) by striking out Paragraph 2 of said Offer and inserting in lieu thereof a paragraph to read as follows:

"2. By acceptance of this Offer the Applicant covenants to complete the Project with all practicable dispatch, and in any event by December 30, 1939."

Section 2. That said City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, agrees to abide by all the terms and conditions of said Amendatory Offer, including the Terms and Conditions annexed thereto and made a part thereof.

Section 3. That the City Clerk of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, be and he is hereby authorized and directed forthwith to send to the federal works agency, Public Works Administration three certified copies of the proceedings of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, in connection with the adoption of this Resolution, setting forth this Resolution in full and such further documents or proofs in connection with the acceptance of said Amendatory Offer as may be requested by the Federal Works Agency, Public Works Administration.

An ordinance entitled: "AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF MEAT INSPECTOR AND PROVIDING FOR HIS QUALIFICATIONS AND APPOINTMENT AND FIXING HIS DUTIES AND AUTHORITY, AND REQUIRING THE FLESH OF ALL CATTLE, SHEEP, SWINE, CALVES AND OTHER DOMESTIC ANIMALS TO BE INSPECTED AND STAMPED BEFORE SAME ARE OFFERED FOR SALE IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO: PROVIDING THAT ALL PERSONS SLAUGHTERING OR SELLING FRESH MEATS OR MEAT PRODUCTS IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, SHALL FIRST OBTAIN PERMIT THEREFORE, AND THE MANNER OF OBTAINING THE SAME, AND FEE THEREFORE: AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTION OF PREMISES WHERE FRESH MEAT IS SOLD OR KEPT FOR SALE: MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO BRING OR CAUSE TO BE BROUGHT IN THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS MEAT OF ANY SUCH ANIMALS WITHOUT THE INSPECTION STAMP OF THE IDAHO FALLS MEAT INSPECTOR OR THE STAMP OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AFFIXED THEREON: PROVIDING FOR THE SELECTION OF A PLACE OF INSPECTION PROVIDING THAT THE HEAD AND THAT CERTAIN VITAL ORGANS SHALL BE INTACT IN THE ANIMAL WHEN SO INSPECTED: PROVIDING THAT REGULATION FOR INSPECTION SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES ESTABLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE: PROVIDING A SCHEDULE OF FEES TO BE CHARGED FOR INSPECTION OF ANIMALS AND COLLECTION THEREOF: MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO COUNTERFEIT, USE OR INTERFERE WITH THE STAMP OF THE IDAHO FALLS MEAT INSPECTOR: PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH" was read in full by the Clerk.

It was moved by Evans, seconded by Wasley, that the ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Wasley, Evans, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wasley, that the rule of law requiring that an ordinance be read at three separate meetings be suspended, and the ordinance be placed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Crabtree, Brandl. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Mehlhoff, seconded by Gourley, that the ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.

The following letter was read:

"Idaho Falls, Ida. Oct. 4, 1939.

To the Hon. Mayor and Gentlemen of the Council:

OCTOBER 6, 1939

I am writing you to ask if it is possible to grant me light and water until I can get some necessary repairs done on my house and garage. I have to get my roof repaired and the garage stuccoed or lose my tenant.

The rent of part of my house is the only income I have.

My daughter has agreed to keep up the table until I can get things caught up and straightened around again. I have kept my taxes paid also the light and water. My daughter is carrying all she is able on her own account and is unable to assist me any more than she is now.

If you can do this for me, I will be most grateful and will gladly assume my light and water as soon as possible.

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Fanning, that the Mayor be authorized to sign a contract with the Shell Oil Company covering the ownership and maintenance of the Junior Chamber of Commerce sign located on their property south of the city. Roll call. Voting aye: Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Brandl, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call. Voting aye: Wasley, Evans, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Absent: Sutton. Motion carried.
