

JUNE 9, 1939

Minutes of a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held June 2nd, 1939, and recessed until June 9th, 1939.

There were present at said meeting Chase A. Clark, Mayor; Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley. Absent: Wasley. When the following proceedings were had, to wit:

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION OF THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IN THE STATE OF IDAHO, AND FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SEVERAL FUNDS AND PURPOSES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1939-1940 AND PROVIDING THE NUMBER OF MILLS ON THE DOLLAR APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OF SAID FUNDS" was read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Crabtree, that the ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Absent: Wasley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the rule of law requiring that an ordinance be read at three separate meetings be suspended, and the ordinance be placed on its second and third readings. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Voting nay: None. Absent: Wasley. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Sutton, that the ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans. Voting nay: None. Absent: Wasley. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk and it was moved by Mehlhoff, seconded by Brandl, that the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading and be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Absent: Wasley. Motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered 522 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post-Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

The following applications for building permits were read:

- No. 2050 signed by A. F. Douglass
- No. 2051 signed by R. C. Beazer.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the permits be approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Absent: Wasley. Motion carried.

It was moved by Evans, seconded by Fanning, that the bills for the month of May, 1939, in the sum of \$34,738.58 be allowed, and warrants be drawn on the proper funds in payment of same. Roll call. Voting aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl. Absent: Wasley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The following resolution was read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, now has under course of construction a street paving project in co-operation with the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, designated as Docket: Ida. 1158-F; and,

WHEREAS, the work has progressed to a point where additional funds are needed to continue the work and no more funds are due and payable from the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works until the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, has deposited in the First Security Bank of Idaho, Idaho Falls Branch, the sum of \$16,501.05;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Clerk be, and is hereby, ordered to issue warrants in the amount of \$16,501.05, in denominations not to exceed \$2,000.00, and that these warrants be purchased as an investment from the Meter Deposit Investment Fund to draw two percent (2%) interest per annum until paid from the General Fund of the City, and the proceeds deposited to the construction account for Street Improvement District No. 18, designated Docket: Ida. 1158-F."

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Brandl, that the resolution be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning. Voting nay: None. Absent: Wasley. Motion carried.

Bid was received from the Bonneville Auto Company for one Ford Truck \$2,448.00 F.O.B. Factory. The Mayor referred the bid to the Street & Alley Committee.

The following Petition was read:

“Idaho Falls, Ida.
June 5th, 1939.

The Hon. Mayor and City Council
Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, wish to express our regrets at your action in favoring the installation of Parking Meters on the streets of Idaho Falls, in view of the fact that we consider them;

1. Absolutely unnecessary.
2. They can do nothing, that rigid traffic law enforcement, will not do.
3. A source of added expense to farmers and citizens of Idaho Falls who wish to trade in the store of Idaho Falls.
4. A nuisance and detriment to business.
5. A penalty against farmers who make Idaho Falls their shopping centre, and who, if obliged to pay for this facility, will go elsewhere to trade.
6. As working entirely against the interests of Idaho Falls merchants who need the business and good will of their farmer friends.
7. As working strictly against the policy, which is so needed at the present time, of putting more men to work, as this is a step to use mechanical policemen.
8. Premature.

9. Another means of sending a lot of money out of town, money that could be spent in regular trade channels.

We will thank you gentlemen to give this matter further consideration, before adopting such a drastic and unnecessary experiment.

We further recommend that if the present police force is not adequate to properly regulate the traffic, that additional policemen be hired.

Also, that a "Beat" system be inaugurated for the police force, so that the city can be adequately policed at all times."

Signed by approximately one hundred
Merchants and businessmen.

It was moved by Mehlhoff, seconded by Brandl, that the petition be deferred until the next regular meeting, June 16th, 1939. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Absent: Wasley. Motion carried.

It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Brandl, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Brandl, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Voting nay: None. Absent: Wasley. Motion carried.

Passed and approved this 16th day of June, 1939.
