

February 17, 1939

Minutes of a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, held February 17th, 1939.

There were present at said meeting Chase A. Clark, Mayor: Lee Walker, City Clerk; Councilmen Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Absent: None. When the following proceedings were had, to wit:

Minutes of last regular meeting were read and approved.

The Salary Ordinance fixing the salaries for the term May 1st, 1939, to April 30th, 1941, was presented to the council for consideration. It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Wing, that the Mayor be paid the sum of \$2500.00 per annum. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mehlhoff, seconded by Evans, that each councilman be paid the sum of \$480.00 per annum. Roll call. Voting aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Wasley, seconded by Sutton, that the City Clerk be paid the sum of \$2500.00 per annum. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Crabtree, that the City Treasurer be paid the sum \$1380.00 per annum. Roll call. Voting aye: Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Gourley, that the bonds of the City Clerk and City Treasurer shall be \$25,000.00 each. Roll call. Voting aye: Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

After fixing the amount of salaries and bonds to be placed in the ordinance, the ordinance was read in full by the Clerk, and it was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wing, that the ordinance be passed on its first reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Fanning, that the rule of law requiring that an ordinance be read at three separate meetings be suspended, and the ordinance be placed on its second, third, and final reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Evans, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the ordinance be passed on its second reading. Roll call. Voting aye: Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was again read in full by the Clerk. It was moved by Crabtree, seconded by Wing, that the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, and be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The ordinance was then numbered 517 and passed to the Mayor for his approval, and was by him, the Mayor, duly signed and approved and ordered published in one issue of the Post Register, the official newspaper of the City of Idaho Falls.

The following letter was read:

“Idaho Falls, Idaho, February 15, 1939.

TO THE HON. MAYOR CLARK & CITY COUNCIL
OF IDAHO FALLS.

Greetings:

We, the Idaho Falls Central Labor Council, ask your support toward making the library job a Union job. We ask you, as sponsors of the project, to instruct your architect and Contractor that you prefer Union Labor in preference to non-Union men or men taken from the relief rolls.

We can furnish the Contractor with better men in all the Building trades crafts than he can get by hiring non-Union men. He will be forced to pay the same wage for a non-Union man as he will pay for Union man.

Our Building Trades Committee will meet with you tonight to answer any questions you may wish to ask.

It was moved by Sutton, seconded by Fanning, that the request be granted. Roll call. Voting aye: Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The following resolution was read:

RESOLUTION TRANSFERRING FUNDS

WHEREAS, on November 7th, 1938, the City Council authorized the Mayor and City Clerk to make, execute and deliver to the First Security Bank, Idaho Falls, Idaho, cash warrants of the City of Idaho Falls, in the total sum of Ten Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$10,000.00) to be placed on deposit in said Bank and kept in a separate account to be used in financing the construction of a water stand-pipe known as P. W. A. Project No. 1190F; and,

WHEREAS, said P. W. A. Project No. 1190F was cancelled by the Public Works Administration with the consent of the City of Idaho Falls;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to transfer said funds now on deposit in the First Security Bank, Idaho Falls, Idaho, to P. W. A. Project No. 1254F known as Docket Ida. 1254F, Library Addition.

It was moved by Fanning, seconded by Evans, that the resolution be adopted and approved. Roll call. Voting aye: Crabtree, Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

The following Resolution was read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, made application to the Department of Public Works, Boise, Idaho, for permission to construct and maintain a four-inch pipe line across the right of way and under the road bed of the State (Yellowstone Trail) Highway in the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 25, Township 2 North, Range 37 East of the Boise Meridian; and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works has submitted an agreement granting to the City of Idaho Falls the right to construct and maintain a four-inch pipe line across the right of way and under the road bed of the Yellowstone Trail Highway (F.A.P. 14-A) in the Northeast quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 25, Township 2 North, Range 37 East of the Boise Meridian.

WHEREAS, it appears it would be to the best interests, benefit and advantage of said City of Idaho Falls that said agreement be executed;

NOW THEREFORE, Be It Resolved, that said agreement be, and the same is hereby accepted on part of and by the said City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, and that the Mayor and City Clerk of said City be, and they are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to execute said agreement in the name of and on behalf of said City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, to affix the corporate seal of said City thereto and

that when so executed, the said agreement shall in all respects be the agreement of the said City of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

It was moved by Gourley, seconded by Wasley, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the resolution and agreement. Roll call. Voting aye: Wing, Fanning, Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Wing, seconded by Mehlhoff, that the meeting adjourn. Roll call. Voting aye: Gourley, Mehlhoff, Wasley, Evans, Sutton, Crabtree, Wing, Fanning. Voting nay: None. Motion carried.
