I, Lee Walker, being the fully elected, qualified and acting Clerk of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, do hereby certify that the following Resolution was regularly passed and adopted by the City Council at the regular Meeting thereof held on the 7th day of October, 1938.

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RESOLUTION FIXING
MINIMUM WAGE RATES

WHEREAS, a thorough investigation has been made of the hourly wage rates which are being paid in the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, which is the locality in which the proposed Project 1158-F (hereinafter referred to as "Project") is to be constructed by the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho to employees in each trade or occupation engaged in work of a nature similar to the work to be performed in the construction of said Project, and the prevailing hourly wage rates being paid in such locality to such employees for such work has been determined by rates paid on Project Ida. 1021-R. Street Improvements, Idaho Falls, in 1937; Docket 1029-DS, School Building, Idaho Falls, Idaho; Highway Department, State of Idaho.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, that the following rates for the respective trades or occupations listed below shall be and are hereby fixed as the minimum hourly wage rates and have been determined in accordance with rates prevailing for work of a similar nature in the locality in which the Project is to be constructed:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the foregoing list of trades or occupations includes to the best of our knowledge, all the classifications of employees who will be engaged in work on said Project other than executive, supervisory, administrative, clerical or other non-manual workers as such.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there be transmitted with this Resolution the substantiating data upon which the foregoing determination is based."

RESOLUTION NO.1

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF THE UNITED STATES TO THE CITY OF IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO, TO AID BY WAY OF GRANT IN FINANCING THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE WATERWORKS SYSTEM.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho.

Section 1. That the offer of the United States of America to the City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, to aid in the construction of improvements to the water system be and the same is hereby in all respects accepted.

Section 2. That said City of Idaho Falls, Idaho, agrees to abide by all the terms and conditions of said offer, including the terms and conditions annexed thereto and made a part thereof.

Section 3. That the City Clerk be and he is hereby authorized and directed forthwith to send to the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works three certified copies of the proceedings of the City Council in connection with the adoption of this Resolution setting
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forth this Resolution in full, and such further documents or proofs in connection with the acceptance of said offer as may be requested by the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works of the State of Idaho, has submitted plans for the improvement of the Yellowstone Park (U. S. 91) State Highway northerly from and in the vicinity of the City of Idaho Falls, said improvement to consist of landscaping the right of way with lawn, shrubs, and trees, said project being designated as Federal Aid Project No. 21-A (2), Roadside Improvement; and,

WHEREAS, the allotment of Federal and State funds for the improvement is contingent on compliance with the laws governing State highway and State highway traffic, availability of necessary right of way and adequate provision by the local unit for a water supply for the completed improvement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the location of the proposed State highway improvement as shown by the plans is hereby accepted and approved, plats of which improvement are ordered marked Exhibit "A" and filed by the City Clerk.

2. That the State of Idaho is to construct the proposed improvement and install the necessary water piping and sprinkling system, at its expense, and the City of Idaho Falls is to provide at all times an adequate water supply at no expense to the State in order that the improvement may be maintained by the City to the standard to which it is constructed.

3. That certified copies of this Resolution shall be furnished the Department of Public Works of the State of Idaho and the United States Bureau of Public Roads.

The petition of Roy McMann, Hattie R. McMann, Robert Henry Deshazer and Lillie M. Deshazer, respectfully represents and requests and prays, as follows:

That Roy McMann and Hattie R. McMann are the owners and in possession of Lots 1 to 6, both inclusive, and Lots 45 to 48, both inclusive, in Block 2 of Mayflower Addition to the City of Idaho Falls as per the recorded plat thereof.

That Robert Henry Deshazer and Lillie M. Deshazer are the owners and in possession of Lots 8 to 34, in Block 1 of Mayflower Addition to the City of Idaho Falls, as per the recorded plan or plat thereof.

That what is known as Higbee Street extends North and South between said Blocks One and Two, being the Westerly boundary line of said Block One and the Easterly boundary line of said Block Two. That what is known as Lloyd Street, formerly Taylor Street, extends East and West along the South side of said Blocks One and Two and what is known as Anderson Street extends East and West along the North side of the aforesaid Blocks.

That the City of Idaho Falls, by Ordinance, has closed a considerable portion of Higbee Street and all of Lloyd Street, due to the fact said closed portions were on the rights of way of the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company. That by reason of such closing of Higbee Street, there was left, cut off from the balance of the street, that portion of said street extending between said Blocks One and Two of Mayflower Addition. That said portion of said street is not used by the traveling public, and is of no use or benefit to any person or persons other than your petitioners, who own the contiguous lands.

Wherefore, your petitioners respectfully pray that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Idaho Falls, by proper Ordinance, vacate all that portion of Higbee Street bounded on the East by Block One and on the West by Block Two of Mayflower Addition to said City, and which extends from Anderson Street on the North to Lloyds Street on the South.

And your petitioners will ever pray.
